Who Supports Who in The Democratic Primary?

Which Coalition is Backing Each Major Candidate?

The question of who will win the Democratic nomination is still up in the air with many polls showing former Vice President Joe Biden, Sen. Elizabeth Warren, and Sen. Bernie Sanders leading nationally and Mayor Pete Buttigieg rising in early state polls like Iowa and New Hampshire.

One way to judge candidates is to see their supporters and coalitions. Candidates like Sanders and Biden tend to have multi-racial working class coalitions that are committed while other candidates have mostly white upper-class coalitions that are not as committed.

One should also look at the media moments of former Texas Rep. Beto O'Rourke, Sen. Kamala Harris, Warren, and Buttigieg. All of them had a bump in the polls and a media moment.


O'Rourke had a tight loss to Ted Cruz in Texas for the Senate. Harris caused some controversy after her smack down of Biden on race at the first debate.

Warren, after her positive media coverage and good debate performances, plus Buttigieg's media coverage after his somewhat impressive four debates.

Right now Buttigieg is rising in Iowa and New Hampshire while Warren is losing

half of her support in these states. Nationally, this shows that the white liberal base still has not picked a candidate to get behind.

They first got behind Beto, then Kamala, then Warren, and now Buttigieg. The media plays a big role in making these types of candidates. It's hard to be-

lieve that any of these candidates would be rising with positive coverage from the mainstream media who typically prefer established candidates.

The media even tries to emphasize Sen. Amy Klobuchar but it seems like voters are not buying the same old neo-corporate policies that Klobuchar is trying to sell

A good question to ask is why do Sanders and Biden have similar coalitions, yet vast differences in policies?

The answer is simple: voters don't vote based on policy or ideology- they vote based on feeling and emotion. Sanders plays to the emotion of anger at the es-

Sanders has been fighting for the same policies for about 40 years, which shows that he's consistent and will enact the plans he announces.

Meanwhile, Biden ties himself to the most popular politician in the Democratic Party, Barack Obama, which is why lots of African Americans in South Carolina support Biden.

African American support is mostly broken down on generational grounds with Biden doing best with the older and Sanders doing well with the younger.

The multi-racial working class could be the coalition that will need to turn out if any Democrat wants to beat Trump in 2020.

This also explains why Buttigieg and

Michael Bloomberg Enters 2020 Presidential Race

Former NYC Mayor Files for Primary

CEO of Bloomberg L.P. and former NYC Mayor Michael Bloomberg announced his run for president on November 24. He filed for the Arkansas Democratic primary on November 12.

"Defeating Trump and rebuilding America is the most urgent and important fight of our lives," according to a statement on his campaign website. "And I'm going all in."

Like most Democrats running for the nomination, Bloomberg supports common sense gun control and climate change reform. He is also a proponent of universal healthcare.

Bloomberg's company has partnered with an environmental organization, the Sierra Club, for almost a decade with a mission to shut down the country's coal plants and replace them with sustainable energy.

The CEO's website promotes his middle-class roots. He grew up outside of Boston and was the son of a bookkeeper and a secretary.

Bloomberg worked his way through Johns Hopkins University and Harvard Business School. Laid off at a finance firm in 1981, he began Bloomberg L.P.

Bloomberg served as the mayor of New York City from 2001 through 2013.

Before he announced his run for the presidential election, he apologized for "stop-and-frisk," a controversial policy during his mayoralty.

This policing program targeted black and Latino communities. He visited the Christian Cultural Center, a black megachurch in Brooklyn, on November 17.

A New York Times article about stop-and-frisk concluded that "Only 14 out of every 10,000 stops conducted during the Bloomberg era turned up a gun, and just 1,200 out of every 10,000 ended with a fine, an arrest or the seizure of an illegal weapon, according to police data analyzed by the New York Civil Liberties Union."

Although Bloomberg began his campaign late and missed the Democratic debates, he is making up for lost time with extensive advertising. He has outspent many of his competitors since joining the race.

Critics have accused him of trying to buy the 2020 election. His self-financed advertisements have put him in fourth place out of 15 Democratic candidates in the polls, according to Reuters.

He is not accepting any campaign contributions which disqualifies him from the debates.

In 2001, Bloomberg switched his party affiliation from Democrat to Republican in order to run for mayor on the Republican ticket.

The candidate returned to the Democratic party in 2018. Earlier this year, he announced he would not be joining the race but would support his party.

City Council narrowly approved a measure that allowed Bloomberg to run for

reelection in 2008. The consecutive two-term limit for a mayor was lifted in light of the recession.


"Some people accused the wealthy Mr. Bloomberg as being out of touch with everyday residents in a city where the Occupy Wall Street movement erupted in 2011 to protest the widening divide between rich and poor," mentions the Wall Street Journal.

Bloomberg was often considered distant from the public, as he owned a billion-dollar corporation and did not live at

charter schools, clashed with unions, and attempted to ban sugary drinks larger than 16 ounces.

He also led major redevelopment projects that transformed public spaces in Midtown and the Financial District following 9/11.

The billionaire has contributed a significant portion of his income to causes he is passionate about, such as student financial aid. He donated \$1.8 billion to his alma mater, Johns Hopkins University, in 2018 for this purpose.



The Democratic candidate's campaign is entirely self-financed as of now.

Gracie Mansion like past mayors.

He made major changes to education and public health programs during his three terms. He supported the expansion of

Bloomberg's corporate background, public service, and current philanthropy makes him a moderate candidate for the Democratic nomination.

it didn't all go how we wanted, but I wanna thank you all for hanging with us to make the best out of it."




also hit the point home when she gave a theoretical statistic about what it should be like inside of a law school student. 1% inspiration and 99% motivation.

This is completely false, reaching out can really help with the daily stresses. If anyone ever feels like they've lost control of their lives, stressed, or unhappy there are places that can help you.

CSI has facilities to help any students with different mental disorders like anxiety and depression. Even students that just need someone to talk about their issues with outside of their personal friends and

Instagram's "No-Likes" Policy Causes Uncertainty

Will Removing "Hearts" on IG be Worthwhile, or a Ludicrous Mistake?

Let's face it: a good number of us use social media practically every day. This is far from a bad thing though, as it can be used to communicate with people, find the latest news on topics, or simply to find a way to spend your free time.

While there are several of them, such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and Snapchat, the one that's currently the most controversial is Instagram.

Out of all the social media apps, Instagram by far seems to be the most...questionable, for lack of a better term. In fact, out of all of the social media apps, it by far seems the most fickle, as there's usually no telling what will happen with it.

One of the reasons for this is due to IG making changes in the past that no one asked, such as making DMs much more limited, having posts no longer show up in feeds in chronological order, or no longer having the ability to see what posts your followers like/comment on.

What's most surprising is that this isn't even a new policy when it comes to IG. Being that the app has already removed

likes in Canada, Italy, Japan and New Zealand, and has just now begun to test it in the U.S.

Of course, one might not think that this change is that big to begin with. After all, all it will do is cause an arbitrary number to no longer pop within your feed, right? If only it were that simple.

The thing is that removing likes on Instagram will harm the influencers who use it the most, such as celebrities, YouTubers or content creators, who require this form of engagement and visibility in order to get the attention of brands.

An article from PBS.org from Jamie Leventhal puts it best, which states: "Influencers likes as a mean of attracting advertisers, and now they will have to recalibrate how they do business."

To give an analogy, it would be like a marketing a new product, except the amount of people who purchased the product would only be visible to you and no one else. Without being able to share these analytics, how would a company know if investing in this product is beneficial for them?

As you can see, this change seems to be more trouble than it's worth. After all, wouldn't it be better and more convenient for influencers to leave things as they are now instead?

Unfortunately, IG does not seem to share this mindset. The CEO of Instagram, Adam Mosseri, has stated that this change was done in order to tone down the anxiety and social pressure for youths when it comes to being fixated on likes.

For an everyday teenager who checks their feed daily, one could somewhat see this form of reasoning. Yet this does nothing to quell influencers' fears, especially when there seems to be no plans for an alternative to replace those rosy hearts.

Some influencers such as Nicki Minaj have even threatened to leave the platform


altogether and stick to Twitter instead, while the rapper Rico Nasty stated that Instagram would eventually become as dead as MySpace with this change.

What's In a Nomination For Lizzo, Billie Eilish, and Lil Nas X?

The 2020 Grammy nominations were announced on November 20, 2019

Awards season in the world of arts and entertainment is an exciting and busy time period. It is a time where pop culture's biggest highlights are honored and recognized during an extravagantly glamorous celebration.

The Grammys are no different. The 62nd Annual Grammy Awards are set to take place on January 26, 2020 at the Staples Center in Los Angeles, California and will air live on CBS. Known as music's biggest night, the 2020 ceremony will honor musical achievements and milestones from 2019.

Lizzo is best known for her smash hit "Truth Hurts", a breakup anthem from her album "Cuz I Love You", which is nominated for Album of the Year. "Truth Hurts" is nominated for Record of the Year and Best Pop Solo Performance, in the area of major award categories.

Seventeen-year old singer Billie Eilish is nominated for six awards, making her tied with "Old Town Road" rapper Lil Nas X, who also received six nominations.

Scoring 5 nominations was pop star Ariana Grande, who took the entertainment world by storm with hit songs of

2019 such as "7 Rings" and "Thank U, Next." Not to mention Grande's highly publicized romance with comedian Pete Davidson, which kept people glued to the starlet's drama on and off the stage.

Most audiences can assume that the breakup was a huge influence on the pop project's overall commercial success. A Florida native, Grande is nominated in major categories including Album of the Year ("Thank U, Next"). Record of the Year

("7 Rings"), Best Pop Solo Performance ("7 Rings"), Best Pop Duo/Group Performance ("Boyfriend", a collaboration with Social House), and Best Pop Vocal Album ("Thank U, Next").

The eligibility period for the 2020 ceremony ran from October 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019. There are specific rules for eligibility, and for Song of the Year, the rule is "A song is eligible if it was first released, or if it first achieved prominence during the Eligibility Year."

When Lizzo's "Truth Hurts" was nominated for Song of the Year, many were confused as to how and why a song from 2017 managed to be nominated. Released in 2017 as a single, "Truth Hurts" failed

to chart or make any radio and streaming impact. The song eventually caught on to Billboard in April of 2019, and many cite the usage of the song in the Netflix movie "Something Great" for the song's success, two years after its release.

After reaching top status on Billboard in September, the song was eyed by audiences and Grammy administrators everywhere. How did the song score a significant nomination? It was later learned that

the song "qualifies for the 2020 Grammys because the song was never submitted for contention in the Grammys process and it appears on an album released during the eligibility period for the upcoming show" (Newsweek publication, November 2019). Lizzo might have proved that good music really has no expiration date.

Dan + Shay are nominated for Best Country Duo/Group Performance and Best Country Song for their hit "Speechless." Country superstar Blake Shelton is nominated for Best Country Solo Performance with the prideful and patriotic hit "God's Country." Other nominees across the country categories include Brothers Osborne, Thomas Rhett, Miranda Lambert, and Eric Church.

As rap and hip hop continue to peak across the charts, so does their Grammy nominations. Tyler, The Creator's critically-acclaimed album "Igor" is one of five albums up for Best Rap Album. The album's aesthetic and artistic feel made the album a modern favorite among rap fans.

The album's subliminal themes of romance, sexuality, being trapped in a love triangle, and good versus evil showcase Tyler, The Creator's talent and bring out a gothic, dark romantic side of the musician. ald Trump's Inauguration. When introduced, the announcer said that "they became a world-wide internet sensation with one of the most viewed YouTube channels on the planet."


That is true. Since 2008, The Piano Guys have over 6 million subscribers and 1.4 billion views on YouTube.

As Linden states, "By 2014, a number of scientists had concluded that an



The same experience can allow the artist to think in a more creative, unusual way. A muse can make it easier to complete a work of art.


