Dorms Start to Build on Campus

As CSI Starts Construction, Students Lose Handball Courts

In preparation for the construction of student dorms several handball courts have been closed off, causing students to create a petition to speed the rebuilding process.

On March 5th, students who were using adjacent handball courts watched in dismay as metal poles and rolls of chain-link fence were place on the floor of the courts closest to the baseball field, while contractors marked the outline where the fence would be constructed with spray paint.

"I don't even know what to say," said CSI student and handball player Wilson Lung. "What are we supposed to do?"

By Tuesday, March 6th, metal guide poles were cemented into the ground for the fence to be put against. CSI students who used the handball and basketball courts regularly or periodically were upset because felt that they were not given enough notice or time to either respond to or be involved in the process of removal and relocation of the recreation

"It's a shame," said student Angelo Iasevoli. "They should be rebuilt immediately."

CSI student and handball player John Purdy wanted to create a petition to speed the rebuilding process after the removal of the courts when he received the email that was sent out to all CSI students on Monday February 27th. The email sent by Ira Persky informed him of the impending changes and started, "I am very pleased to provide an update on the new Residential Housing Complex. 

Earlier this month, the newly elected Student Government members, voted in during February's in house elections, attended their first public meeting in the College of Staten Island's Green Dolphin Lounge.

The meeting started off with president, Kevin Storberg, going over the agenda and making announcements.

Director of Student Life, Carol Brower, was in attendance. She expressed her congratulations to the new senators and also spoke kind words to all of the members.

"This is the most active Student Government I have seen in awhile," Brower said, speaking of all of the work the senators have done.

She then spoke of the success of the campus event "CSI's Got Talent," as over 90 students auditioned. The top 10-12 finalists will be competing on April 19 for a cash

"It is a fun campus event," Brower said. NYPIRG's Andrew Oppenheimer was a guest speaker and took the floor.

He discussed issues with the shuttle bus and it's sporadic service. He feels that it should be evaluated. He then made an

announcement about Lobby Day that took place on March 14. He explained how it is an opportunity for student leaders to speak to


The Student Government then had a discussion after a representative from a proposed campus event "Everybody's Gay" spoke.



CSI and members of the accounting club welcomed IRS special agent Glantz to talk about his experiences and what it takes to become apart of the IRS.

Agent Glantz, who has spent 20 years in the criminal investigations division is now a public information officer.

There is a whole other aspect to the IRS and he proves it is not all deskwork. Working in the field can prove quite dangerous, however there is plenty of room

"There is a lot of opportunity working for the IRS...you don't have to be stuck

doing the same thing," said Glantz. with marriages to cases brought forth by informants. Examples of the cases are, legal and illegal source, narcotics, and terror. When determining whether a case is

civil or criminal, intent is a key indicator. "I've seen the presentation a few times, but the ways the IRS can get tipped off about fraud was the most interesting to the accounting club.

Most cases come down to greed. The people who steal so they can live lavish lifestyles are usually ones that are investigated. What you have to do is look at the numbers. Sometimes you might see something that doesn't match, so search warrants are often required.

"We don't chase the little guys," said Glantz.





CSI's Study Abroad Program Gets One Student Out of Her Comfort Zone

This past summer, twenty year old Ariana Induddi was able to take advantage of CSI's study abroad program and take classes at the American University of Rome, AUR. Her program started in the quaint little town of Trastevere, Rome.

"I stayed in a beautiful and spacious apartment with four other girls who were all American," said Induddi. "My absolute favorite part had to be this beautiful terrace that overlooked our town."

Starting her days at 8 a.m., she would go to both her classes; Art History of Rome and Digital Design in Communication. Although she knows basic Italian, the language barriers were sometimes rough to overcome especially with her Italian speaking professors.

One color that hasn't yet made a big comeback is bright blue it was of course a



In Celebration of Women's History Month, the Pluralism and Diversity Committee held an anti-women suffrage monologue Someone Must Wash the Dishes: An Anti-suffrage Satire, by Marie Jenney Howe on March 5th.

Many women back in the early 1900's had fought for women rights. At the time, women did it with charm and pretty clothes. It wasn't until the 1920's that the 19th amendment had passed, giving all women the right to vote.

On March 5th, in the center for the arts building, Michele LaRue played the character of "Alice," an anti-suffrage proletariat living in 1912. 



Dean Koontz's 77 Shadow Street-Where Nightmares Become Reality

"Every thirty-eight years comes an event of greater power than mere apparitions. Involuntary pilgrims journey to my kingdom and discover their fate, which is the fate of the

Welcome to a place where nightmare visions become real, and murder, suicide, and disappearance plague its inhabitants. Dean Koontz's latest book, 77 Shadow Street, a mix of science fiction and horror, is a dazzling adventure of a motley crew of characters that have to struggle to keep hold of their lives. Based in reality and the supernatural, 77 Shadow Street, will lead to a gripping journey through a maze of haunting images.

The Pendleton, a luxury apartment complex, stand on a deadly vortex where past, present, and future collide with each other, ushering in as evil presence that seeks to bring terror to anyone who stands in his way. 
Although the plot of the story was fantastically crafted, the characters lack the ability to

The Band Returns With Their Seventh Studio Album

It has been nearly three years since Omaha, Nebraska indie rock veterans, Cursive, released a record. Since then, the band has ridden the success of their last record, Mama, I'm Swollen, touring with notable acts such as Bright Eyes, and playing on late night television shows.

Also during that time frame, frontman Tim Kasher shifted focus to his solo project, releasing his record *The Game of Monogamy* and touring in support of it. This left many fans wondering what was going to happen to Cursive, who has already taken a hiatus once before to make way for Kasher's side proj-

However, the band made their triumphant comeback in late February with the release of their seventh studio album, I am Gemini, on Saddle Creek Records, and it is what many are considering to be a "return to form" for the band, who tried a newer approach with their previous record.

The album, like much of Cursive's prior work, is conceptual. The storyline, according to Kasher, revolves around "twin brothers separated at birth, one good and one evil, their unexpected reunion in a house that is not a home ignites a classic struggle for the soul." The storyline is laid out throughout the album's liner-notes; the thirteen-page booklet includes artwork and stage directions, explaining the album's framework as

The album's opener, "This House Alive", initially appears to be a mellower track. It starts off slowly, with ambient guitars and light drums layed softly beneath Kasher's calming vocals. However, it shortly picks up and gains speed, telling the story of the "good twin", Cassius, and his first venture into the house

The album continues on with "Warmer, Warmer", a track that introduces the "evil twin", Pollock. It features heavy guitar work that manifests itself in Cursive's typical dancey-yet-still-rockand-roll fashion. The song's heavy nature mixed with its poppy undertones makes it one of I Am Gemini's most notable tracks.

Other highlights include "The Sun and the Moon", and "Wowowow". "The Sun and the Moon" is an extremely theatrical number, seemingly fit for a rock opera. Its features dueling time signatures, switching back and forth from 5/4 to 4/4, that creature a very playful sound. "Wowowow" is packed with energy and references to prior Cursive songs and concepts. The song's first words are "the hollow at night," referring to their fifth record, Happy Hollow.

Dear concerned friend,


