### DEANNA ABZUG DENIED TENURE

The Dolphin has learned that Deanna Abzug of the Student Personnel Department has been denied tenure by President William Birenbaum. The President made his decision despite the fact that the Appointments Committee of Student Fersonnel recommended her highly to the Personnel and Budget Consultae who in turn approved the recommendation.

In the opinion of most of the Students who have known, worked with, and have been helped by Miss Abzug, the President's decision is not a good one in keeping with his promise of judging tenure solely on merit.

These students feel that she has been a hard worker FOR the students. She has been working "diligently" as the head of the Drug Abuse Advisory Board, besides consuling students.

The Day Session Student Government will discussathe matter during its first meeting this Thursday.

CUME PROFS REJECT ...... PAYLESS PAYDAYS'

The 6500 career faculty of City University rejected outright Mayor Lindsay's recent proposal to impose "payless paydays" on City employees.

In a letter transmitted today (Friday, October 9) to the Mayor, Chairman Belle Zeller of the Legislative Conference, collective bargaining representative of CUNY's professors, asked, "If 'payless paydays' are permissible, why not workless workdays'?" Prof. Zeller voiced strong objection to a public statement by Assistant Budget Director James A. Cavanagh indicating that the City may be obliged to violate collective bargaining agreements with its employees.

"As long as his statement stands as an expression of City policy," she toud, "it grievously damages the faith of City employees in the City."

The Legislative Conference is currently operating under a threayear contract negotiated with the Board of Higher Education in September 1969 on behalf of CUNY's full-time instructional staff.

CUNY PROFS REJECT ...... 'PAYLESS PAYDATS'

The 6500 carear faculty of City University rejected outright Mayor Lindsay's recent proposal to impose "payless paydays" on City employees.

In a letter transmitted today (Friday, October 9) to the Mayor, Chairman Belle Zeller of the Legislative Conference, collective bargaining representative of CUNY's professors, asked, "If 'payless paydays' are permissible, why not 'workless workdays'?" Prof. Zeller voiced strong objection to a public statement by Assistant Budget Director James A. Covanagh indicating that the City may be obliged to violate collective bargaining agreements with its employees.

"As long as his statement stands as an expression of City policy," she said, "it grievously damages the faith of City employees in the City."

The Legislative Conference is currently operating under a threeyear contract negotiated with the Board of Higher Education in September 1969 on behalf of CUNY's full-time instructional staff.

EVENING SESSION TO HEAR LECTURE
