


"Save The Shuttle" Fails to Save Students Money Transportation Fee Added to Student Activity Funds with Complications



A device that allows students to board the Ferry Shuttle and Loop buses after swiping their Dolphin Cards is the latest attempt Finances and Administration has taken to maintain CSI's million-dollar bus service

After four years of financial turmoil, CSI turns to students for assistance to support Loop and Ferry Shuttle service.

CSI Student Association added the \$40 Transportation Fee to Student Activity fees, which students pay each semester, to continue funding the \$1.6 million bus service.

"Transportation services are great but they are a luxury," said Ira Persky, Vice President of Finances and Administration. "Some people forget that and assume it's expected."

According to the Bursar, the fee was implemented during the first week of the fall 2015 semester after tuition bills were released.

Minutes from a Student Government meeting on November 6 state that the College received a \$400,000 grant from the

state to keep the buses running.

CSI applied for the same grant in 2014. receiving \$185,000.

Over a year ago, Persky proposed the Transportation Fee, believing it could get CSI out of debt.

SG held several meetings throughout the fall and spring semesters discussing the proposal.

According to the meeting minutes, Senators felt the fee was unfair to students who drive to campus because they already pay \$111 for a parking decal.

And in a meeting in April of last semester, an overwhelming vote in favor of the fee was passed, with three rejections and four abstentions. "Our SG didn't agree on much this



When no alternative options proved to be successful, a petition to implement Persky's plan called "Save the Shuttle" was created and brought to students.



The petition received 2,000 signatures. which were verified by Carol Brower, Di rector of Student Life, and the rest of her department and received votes from 803 students online-74 percent of all voters-during the 2015 spring SG elections, according to Hudec.

New Roadway to Alleviate Traffic on Victory Blvd

PROPOSAL FOR CONSTRUCTION ON CHRISTOPHER LANE AWAITS APPROVAL

Councilman Steven Matteo and Staten Island Borough President James Oddo submitted a proposal to the New York State Department of Transportation for the construction of a new roadway through Christopher Lane on July 7.

While the proposal has not been approved yet, the project aims to alleviate traffic on Victory Boulevard.

"This project takes a chaotic, inefficient corridor and improves it by a measurable degree," said Borough President James Oddo in an interview with the Staten Island Advance.

CSI President William J. Fritz also received the proposal and supports the project, believing it will provide a smoother flow for the 15,000 students and 3,000 employees who commute to the campus every day.

"The impetus of this vital project will be supported by the college's Traffic and Transportation Task Force, High Performance Computational Center, and faculty experts," Fritz said.

"I look forward to continuing these discussions in service to our community in order to ultimately provide congestion relief to the 300,000 vehicles that travel this stretch of Victory Boulevard on a weekly basis, as well as the neighborhoods that call it home."

Oddo and Matteo pitched the proposal to extend the lane southward through the Willowbrook Park woodlands and into the campus.

Clash with Celebrated Reporter Further Distances Trump from Sanity

Donald Trump, who leads the polls among Republicans running for the 2016 Presidential election, made another mistake when he argued with Jorge Ramos, one of the most influential Latino reporters in the United States.

During a press conference in Iowa on August 25, Ramos was ejected when he asked the GOP candidate a question regarding his proposal to deport 11 million undocumented immigrants.

Trump refused to let Ramos ask any questions. Growing frustrated, Ramos decided to take matters into his own hands by calling out.

He repeated, "You cannot deport 11 million people. You cannot build a wall for 1,900 miles," referring to comments Trump had made in the past about building a wall that would separate the Mexican-American border.

Trump, irritated, began a shouting match with Ramos. "You do not have the right to ask questions," he told Ramos."You haven't been called."

In addition, Trump suggested that Ramos should "Go back to Univision."

Ramos was ejected from the press conference. A video surfaced online showing the reporter being harassed and yelled at Trump's security personnel.

Men in black suits are heard mocking him and telling him to "go back to [your] country" and "You don't belong here." Ramos fought back, stating that he was a citizen of the United States.

This is also the first time that Ramos has ever been kicked out of a press conference. Ramos was let back in and was allowed to ask questions.

However, this isn't the first time that Trump and Ramos have clashed

Ramos has been upset with Trump's comments since his announcement earlier this summer.



Trump has given very few insights into his views on domestic policies and even less on foreign affairs.

Trump's hostility towards Hispanics may turn out to be extremely troubling for the Republican party down the road.

The GOP's attempt to court Hispanic and Latino voters for the 2016 race are the reason that candidates such as Marco Rubio, a Cuban American, and Jeb Bush who is fluent in Spanish, were championed as early favorites.

Now, according to a CNN/ORC International poll, Trump tops GOP candidates with 30 percent of support from likely primary voters, while Bush is at 9 percent and Rubio has fallen down to 3 percent. Trump's high polling also makes it borderline unethical for news media to not cover or ignore him.

The conversation around immigration policy has also been regressed to the simplistic solution of building a wall, stripping certain immigrants of birthright citizenship, and deportation.

To add to the controversy, Trump's series of derogatory comments have also been directed towards women, giving Democrats a chance to frame the Republican party as a party of older white males.

Latino youth have expressed outrage on social media, putting up memes of Trump and asking questions.

On Twitter, numerous hashtags have been created that questioning Trump's policy positions.

Pundits have been speculating that Trump may have an approach to the campaign similar to Obama's 2008 effort, in that minority youths, this time Hispanics and Latinos, may register and vote at higher rates than usual.

Former Swim Coach Aims to Sue College Again

Soloviev Claims Racism, Sexism, Age Among Reasons for Termination

An arbitrator has ruled to uphold the November 2011 firing of Oleg Soloviev, a former College of Staten Island swim coach, and has once again rejected his \$25 million lawsuit against the College.

The arbitrator cited the fact that the coach promised Russian student-athletes housing and jobs, including ones as life guards before entering entered the United States.

"The employer had just cause for termination," wrote Deborah M. Gaines, the arbitrator, in late August.

"The recorded evidence establishes [Soloviev] had a long tenure with the college and an established history of dedication to his duties and athletes," Gaines wrote

"However, none of these factors can provide sufficient mitigating circumstanc es, given the magnitude of his dishonesty and misconduct in this case."

In Gaines' recent ruling she put a portion of the blame on CSI for "[failing] to exercise enough oversight" on Soloviev.

A CSI spokesperson contended that the college acted to the best of its ability in the handling of Soloviev and said that administration is content with the arbitrator's ruling.

"The college has always maintained that it has acted in a lawful and just manner, and in the interest of safety for our students and our community members, in regards to this matter," Kenneth Bach. CSI's spokesperson, told the Staten Island Advance in a statement.

"We are pleased that the final resolution has been reached in support of our position.'

Soloviev told the Advance that he will, once again, appeal the decision.

Soloviev's misconduct came to light when CSI President William Fritz alerted the campus community via a December 2013 letter stating that the NCAA was looking into possible violations to the organization's bylaws.

Penalties from the NCAA included a four-year probation placed on CSI and a two-year postseason ban for the Men's swimming team

Linguistics Department Looks to Meet Students Demands

A Speech Pathology program is in the vorks at CSI with the help of sixty students and professors Jason Bishop and Christina `ortora

When completed, CSI will be the only nstitution in Staten Island that offers it.

"Language is a window into how the rain works," said Jason Bishop, Linguistics professor at CSI.

For a career as a Speech Pathologist, Bishop says that a bachelor's degree is not required. Those who want to pursue a career in speech must receive a Master's degree and complete several certifications.



"We believe a new collector road and additional entrance drive to the College of Staten Island can be created adjacent to the southern map line of Victory Boulevard within the bed of existing mapped parkway.

The parkway right-of-way adjoins the campus proper to the west," the letter for the proposal stated.

This indicates that the land is the property of the Department of Transportation's mapped unbuilt highway.

Funds from the decal also support paying for snow removal.

Last winter, \$175,000 was spent on snow removal alone.

Administration predicts that, with the help of state funds, roads will be repaired within the next 18 months.


The price of the parking decal has increased within the past year, with funds from that, according to Finances and Administration, going towards the creation of new parking spots, including the 47 new

Oddo and Matteo believe this will help quicken the bureaucratic process.

"Government needs to learn how to get out of its own way and complete proj ects in a much more timely fashion," Otto said.

"It should not take two decades to complete a project that everyone agrees on."

With five pedestrian fatalities from 2008 to 2012 and a speed limit that was dropped to 25 mph as of last June, Victory Boulevard is known as one of the most



ones in Lot 4.

"Our parking cost is nothing compared to campuses in New Jersey," said Persky. "You'd be shocked to see what they have to pay."

The Transportation fee is predicted to accumulate \$1.1 million in revenue. It will not cover all expenses but Finances and Administration suggests it's a step in the right direction. When Administration was asked about a backup plan, they stated that the fee would be successful and would improve as time goes on.

Persky claimed that he could not predict the impact of the fee in five years.

Students have reported that they are charged an extra \$10 when they swipe their Dolphin Card upon boarding the buses.

Persky denied that these charges had to do with the Transportation Fee and if anyone has any questions, they should speak to him directly.

"All the money will go back to the college," said Brower.

"It will all go towards improving the transportation on campus."







What Happens When A Question is Answered Incorrectly

Liz Garbus' Netflix documentary "What Happened, Miss Simone?" which illustrates the rise and "fall" of Nina Simone, the singer-songwriter and civil rights activist, is a film that doesn't answer its question.

Though, that's not completely correct. In its attempt, the film does something remarkable: It answers its question incorrectly.

Simone is painted, after the hype of her marriage to Andrew Stroud sours, for close to an hour as a "monster"-accompanied by



short sequences of unflattering photos of the star-and an entitled, pretentious, "sex fiend" before the ill-placed reveal.

Her daughter, Lisa Simone, talks about her confusion as to why her mother went from loving to aggressive as the stress upon the singer increased. Nina found solace in using her voice as a weapon to strengthen the civil rights movement in an effective. message.

So passionate was she about fighting for one's life. civil rights that she only played songs that dealt explicitly with it, making it hard for her that. to secure shows and airtime on the radio.

(likely) triggered a higher level of intensity of her episodes—something that, because of the timing of the "reveal," made interviewees seem oblivious to her depression.

Increasingly puzzling is the presence of Simone's ex-husband. Andrew Stroud. whose presence in the film is quite disturbing: He gets an opportunity to speak ill of his former wife, trying to convince viewers that his time with Simone was just as confusing as watching her struggle with manic depression-he says she was influenced by civil rights activists, calling her a "terrorist" and, in cringe-worthy fashion, tries to justify the beatings, abuse, and mental and emotional exhaustion he contributed to Simone's life.

The tone and pace of the film is just as brooding and dark as Simone's singing voice. which, before touched by the pain and anger she channeled through it as a result of racism and the civil rights movement, still highlighted emotions that manifest a depth that reached an unimaginable place.

While not enough time is dedicated to focusing on Nina's art, fragments of interviews with her, and clips of her songs remind us of

How An Instagram Filter Got Accused of Racism

Examining Nylon's "Lark" Controversy

Is filtering a picture racist? As we progress in society, one should question why this is an issue. Our definition of beauty constantly changes.


One method of these changes find themselves in the edited photos we see on billboards and magazines, photos that suggest their subject is the epitome of ultimate beauty. The edits are often focused on altering one's skin color or weight, and, as a result, receive waves of backlash

In early August, I created my own wave when my favorite Instagrammer found a problem with this notion. Jenny, who operates under the handle @shelovesdresses, criticized Nylon Magazine's use of her photo on their shop Instagram page @nylonshop.

She was pictured on the shop's account in a product shirt with the caption "Praying for My Haters." Jenny is a Filipino-Chinese American activist for feminism and human rights.

The photo was reposted on the shop account, allegedly filtered with the popular Instagram filter Lark. Instagram feeds exploded, prompting Jenny to urge her followers to petition that the filtered photo be taken down.

I first wondered why this was a big deal. As a normal bystander and often on the Internet, using a filter on an app like Instagram is second nature. If one wanted to enhance a photo, it can all be done in seconds, with one of the 20-plus filters available. But as I read responses to @shelovesdresses's Instagram, I



began understanding why this was a big deal. Jenny's outrage with Nylon was that the filter lightened her skin. Users tested the photo with the filter but found that it did not do what Jenny suggested and that her photo could have instead been photo-shopped.

Curious, I decided to test the filter myself. Taking a screen shot of the original, I tested the photo with the Lark filter. Though the filter lightened her skin, it didn't resemble the edit in question.

apology. Along with the release of the apology, Nylon released an article called "Are Instagram Filters Racist? Are We Making it Worse by Using One?" The article was the "general apology" to Jenny from the companv

Though the article explained how vintage filters were considered racist due to their low-quality nature in the 1970s, it did not fit the aesthetic of what the company tried to explain. Nylon claimed to use a universal filter Other filters brightened Jenny's face for every photo in order to fit a certain theme. But the article seemed to want a person's opinion, rather than explain the situation completely. The article also referenced the apology released by Katherine Martinez of It took days before Nylon released an Nylon Shop, which was listed in the official

Instagram account.

"It pains me to think that you felt this way. We put all of our photos through one of several Instagram filters (in this case it was Lark) to unify the overall look and feel of our feed when #regramming from other accounts-often celebrating fans of ours.

Most Instagram filters tend to blow things out in a "vintage" fashion and if you'll notice it is the entire image (t-shirt included) [that] appears lighter. We have now enacted a policy not to put anyone's reposted images through filters so as not to lead to any misconceptions.

When I first read the apology, I felt it lacked sincerity. When Martinez wrote in the beginning of the letter, "as a woman of color myself," it was as if it screamed "sympathy." I scoffed at the idea that they would actualv get rid of the photo, assuming that they would not keep their word. Usually companies would keep a front and become shady as the controversy dies.

But looking at the featured updated posts on the account, Jenny's criticism was answered with Nylon's response. The re-posted pictures now do not contain any filters whatsoever. I could honestly commend Nylon for keeping its word. But, regarding how Jenny's issue was handled, it was not great on the company's part.

Despite the unsolicited use of a photo, the company seems to be taking a step towards handling future incidents and keeping each image as close to the original as possihle


