The Board of Estimate yesterday gave official approval to a 35-acre site in Sunnyside as a permanent campus for Staten Island Community College and authorized immediate steps to vest title

to it in the city.

Most of the site is undeveloped woodland, bounded on the north by the right of way of the Clove Lakes Expressway and on the west by the route of the proposed Richmond Parkway, However, there are live small parcels within the site which must still be nequired

The board sufficized the controiler to begin proceedings to acquire the site and appropriated \$80,147 to cover the city's share of the cost. The state will pay an equal share of the value of the site, which has been appraised at \$160,295.
