UNIFINISHIED HIISTORY

* * * * *

Today's ceremonies, inaugurating the newly-born Staten Island Community College, mark the fulfillment of a cherished dream of generations of Staten Islanders. The story of its foundation is one of men and women working devotedly for years to bring to fruition the hopes of the Staten Island Community.

Were it not for the joint efforts of such persons as Albert V. Maniscalco, President of the Borough of Richmond, Supreme Court Justice Edward G. Baker, Arleigh B. Williamson, Staten Island member of the Board of Higher Education, Senator Edward V. Curry, Dr. Joseph B. Cavallaro, Chairman of the Board of Higher Education, the Honorable Robert F. Wagner, Mayor of the City of New York, and the enthusiastic support of hundreds of citizens of Staten Island, we should not today be celebrating this historic opening of the College.

The campaign for publicly-supported higher education goes at least as far back as 1932, when thousands of Staten Islanders petitioned for a city college. Again in 1937 and 1938 there was a similar campaign. However, City approval was not secured.

The creation of the State University in 1948, legally authorized to share with local communities the financing and operation of community colleges, once more gave impetus here to the movement for a public college, which in 1948 and 1949 came closer to success than any previous attempts. Supported by the Board of Higher Education and the Trustees of the State University, this 1949 effort made possible eventual victory, which came in 1955 when the Borough President of Richmond, the Mayor, and the far-sighted Board of Estimate gave their approval. Later in the spring the City Administration and the Board of Higher Education received State University approval; and the Staten Island Community College became a reality.

Shortly thereafter, Dean Walter L. Willig, of City College, was appointed President; a staff was selected, a site acquired, a student body enrolled, building alterations made, and equipment acquired. The College starts small in physical plant and possessions. But the enthusiasm and devotion of its staff is of great promise for the future of higher education in our Borough.

This is Staten Island's college, the dream of its people, the achievement of its State and City officials. Its future history remains to be written. If its faculty and students in the years to come labor as lovingly as those who made the college possible, that history will be a glorious one.
