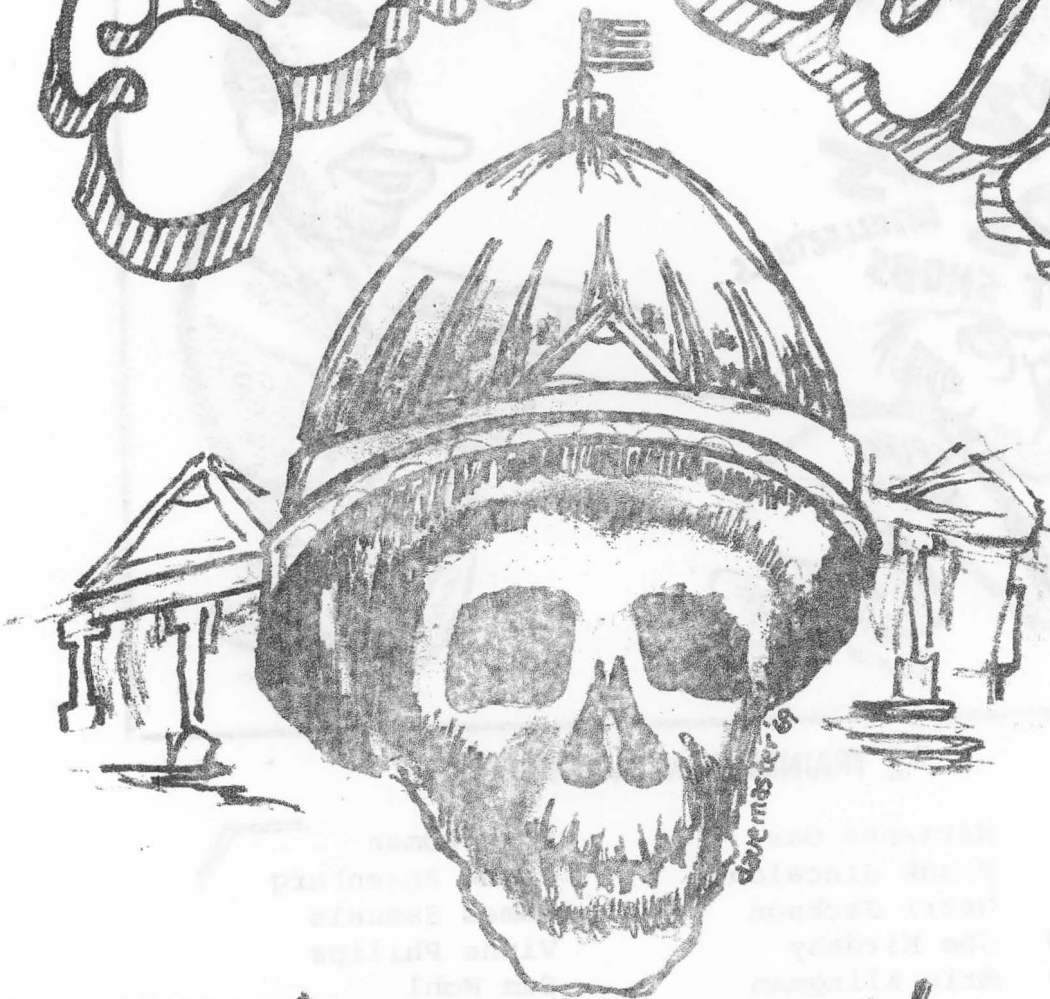

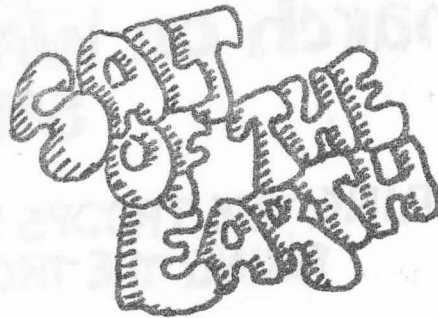

WORKING MORE, ENJOYING IT LESS?

The Viet Nam conflict continues with the sanction of Nixon while hundreds on both sides shed their blood. But the war is also a parasite to the workers in the U.S. Government figures prove it; workers' wages are moving backwards. While this is no surprise to any working-class families trying to make ends meet in this inflation-ridden and tax heavy country, what may be to some is that many workers are working LONGER HOURS FOR LESS MONEY.

In a recent report issued by the N.Y. Teamsters Joint Council (all figures taken from governmental sources), the effect of inflation and taxes on recent wage increases in New York City are detailed for a number of industries. For instance:

Workers in electric, gas and sanitation services, as a group, averaged \$14.00 in weekly wage increases from 1965 to 1968-but they never saw the dough. Inflation-higher prices-wiped out \$12.39 of that "increase". And increased taxes-federal, state, and city income taxes, and social security. The "four-way tax bite" took another \$8.15, leaving these workers with \$6.54 LESS in take-home purchasing power or realwages than they had in 1965.

An even more agonizing example is among workers in the chemical industry. Here \$15.41 in wage "increases" from '65 to '68 was more than chopped away by the inflation bite of \$6.70-leaving these workers with a loss of \$1.89. BUT, the average workweek of these workers went UP by 1.9 hours. In other words they are getting \$1.89 LESS in real wages, and working just about two hours a week MORE for it.

These are not isolated examples. Workers in transportation equipment; weekly increase, \$12.88; inflation bite, \$9.98; tax bite, \$5.71; a net LOSS of \$3.31 and working 1.3 hours a week MORE for that loss.

I MUST PLEAD GUILTY

The following statement was made at a press conference Oct. 9th, called to announce the demonstration, by Staff Sergeant Selwyn Rick Lee.

As a former guard at the Fort Dix Stockade in 1964 and a guard at the Long Bien Stockade in Vietnam in 1966, I hereby state that I am in full agreement with the charges made against the army concerning the stockade conditions and the treatment of prisoners confined in these stockades.

I have personally witnessed many acts of brutality by guards. I have personally seen the filth and smelled the stench of these stockades. I have been personally threatened with both physical and legal reprisals for reporting these incidents. I now personally choose to disregard these threats and make myself available for testimony or anything else which will bring an end to these compounds of torture.

My section chief has threatened me with jail if I expressed any political view. A sergeant First Class who I work with has threatened my life, yet no charges have been brought against him, no attempts made to insure my safety.

It is apparent that I am being persecuted for specific crimes, to which I must plead guilty:

- 1) That I blatantly concern myself with the suffering of my fellow men.
- 2) That I strive to eradicate racism in the army.
- 3) That I do concern myself with the feeding of children in the ghetto.
- 4) That I wish to give words, such as freedom, equality, and love, meaning instead of tired rhetoric.
- 5) That I wish and actively pursue a return to the people of the powers robbed from them by

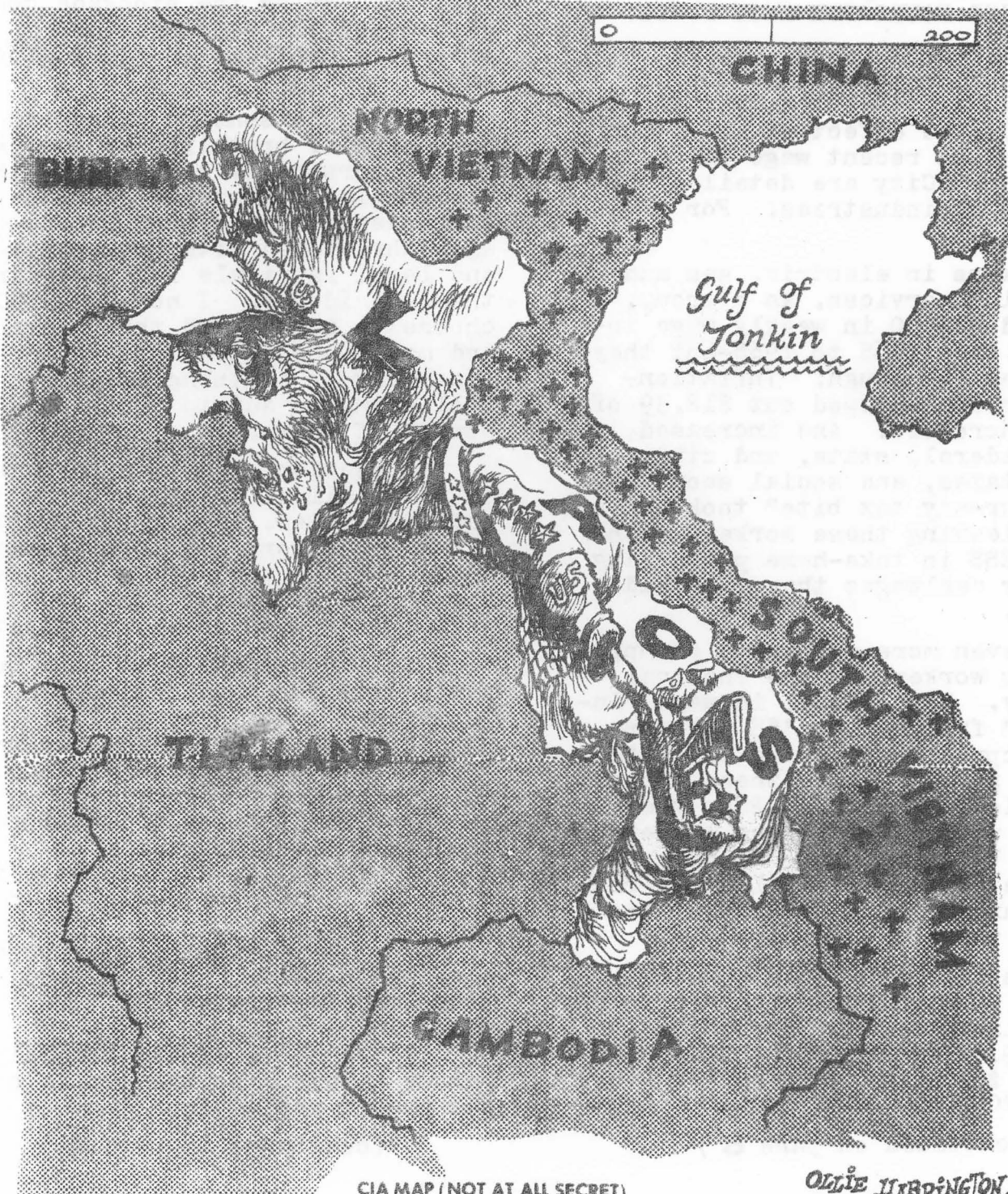
DICK'S DELIVERY - A NATIONAL FARCE

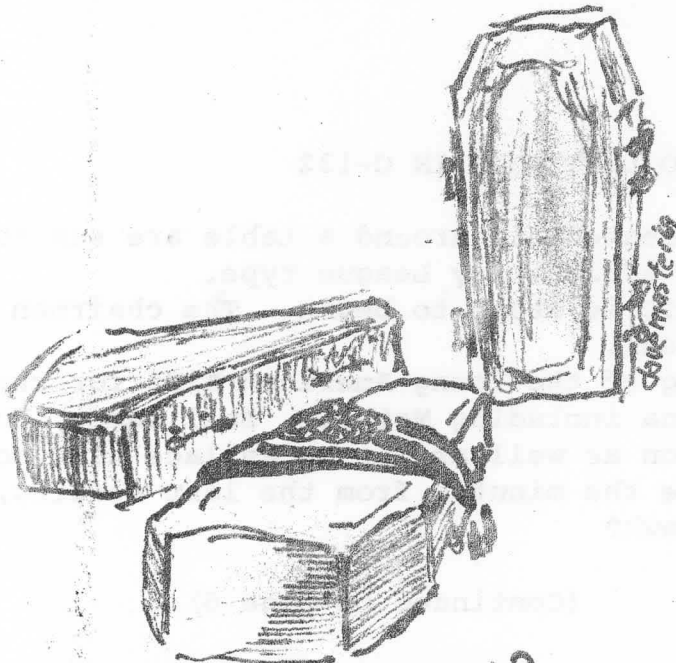

In July he spoke with a personal friend of Ho Chi Minh and even wrote the Asian Leader a ludicrous letter of pitiful platitudes, calling for his support. With the tears of laughter rolling down my face, the babbling buffon read excerpts from this trivial treatise which pledged to "reaffirm in solemnity my desire to work for a just peace" and promising that "... you will find us forthcoming and open-minded!" Ho's reply was recieved three days before his death and it was said that the answers simply reiterated the position of North Vietnam and refused peace. Nixon firmly stated that the fault still lies with Hanoi's acceptance of concessions but refusal to negotiate.

Immediatly following this cleansing of American guilt, I was finally let in on the big secret everyone had waited for, our president's plan To End The War. With his blubbery cheeks contorting like a pregnant jellyfish and starting the second phase of this historic moment by seeking to imbue morality like an old Sicilian, the boring babboon eventually got to the peace plan which would be in line with a major shift in U.S. foreign policy. NIXON'S "NEW" WAR POLICY

Reliable sources have disclosed that there was a gala celebration at the Pentagon after Nixon guaranteed them that he is going to continue a war policy in Vietnam. Rumor has it that an even greater celebration took place among that cabal of generals, landlords, and profiteers our government supports in Vietnam.

For almost a year now, the Nixon Administration has been trying to fool the people with the rhetoric of peace. During this time, the U.S. has brought destruction to one of the smallest nations in the world. Thousands of men, women, and children have been murdered.

What has been the result? A horror and bloodletting that would appall any "silent American", if they knew the truth. The only victory has been for the American manufacturers of death and their associates. They have reaped enormous profits.

The true cause of American militarism and imperialism is the unsatisfiable desire of powerful business interests for the Almighty Dollar. These are the same groups that profit by not supplying food to hungry people, by not making safe automobiles, by putting poisons into food, by not providing adequate health and medical care, by not giving coal miners and others decent working conditions, by not providing adequate housing for many people. Instead, they create slums, smog, dirt, and filth. They pollute air, land, water, and the lives of people. They turn the majority of Americans into "silent" robots. They teach people to equate napalm with freedom, profiteering with virtue, ignorance with patriotism, salesmanship with friendship, middle class prostitution with decency, hatred with honorable behavior, and waste consumption with happiness.

Now Nixon has guaranteed these perverted profiteers that he will continue U.S. intervention in the Vietnamese Civil War—a war our government fostered in the first place. Nixon has promised to continue supplying enough aggression to prevent the possibility of peace and freedom for the people of Vietnam.

On November 15, many people are going to show that they are opposed to this deranged state of affairs. In Washington, that Wall Street lawyer, Nixon, and his bosses will be confronted with the truth that cannot be kept silent. The truth about the Vietnam War and the diseased system of exploitation that makes such atrocities inevitable.

Telephone and telegraph workers weekly increase, \$17.48; inflation bite, \$10.94, tax bite \$7.29; a net LOSS of \$.75 a week and working almost an hour a week more.

This trend is followed through with other workers. With workers in whole-sale trades, they have had to work one hour and a half MORE to get \$.40. Even highly paid skilled crafts have been hit. Construction workers have had to work an hour and a half more a week to get \$1.36 more.

Right now, 147,000 workers from General Electric are on strike for higher wages to compensate for their loss of money by inflation. Nixon has refused to end the war and has been working in the background to discourage G.E. from raising wages. Meanwhile, G.E. (which is the second largest war contractor in the country) has continued its unfair labor practices and has attempted to crush the right of workers to strike.

Corporations have increasingly suppressed the right of workers to strike and speak out against unfair labor practices. Corporations continue to reap profits. In the last three years AFTER paying all taxes and expenses corporations have netted \$150 BILLION.

It's easy to see where they got the money from.

However I knew the old boy wouldn't let me down when he said "The pervious administration Americanized the war. This administration will Vietnamese the peace. He continued to glorify his regime by promising Moronic Melvin's visit to Vietnam which encouraged more intense training of South Vietnamese forces and would enable her to fight the war herself. He supported this policy with the facts that air operations have dropped 20%, enemy infiltration has decreased 20%, and by Dec.16, 60,000 men or 20% of American forces will be home. With this insatiable fetish for the percentage of twenty he sought to grasp the nation's support by explaining that the de-americanization of the war would be worked on an orderly scheduled timetable and that a cessation of hostilities would be the conscious decision of the enemy not the U.S. But our leader asserted as a statement of policy and not a warning that if he as commander and chief feels that the enemy forces threaten South Vietnam he will take strong measures to counteract them.

The final phase of this ebrillient epitome of egregious egotism culminated in the statement that he has the power to withdraw all forces immediately but seeks a just peace through South Vietnamese strength to defend their own freedom. His chauvinism was overbearing when he scorned immediate withdrawel, claiming that it would loosen morale and scar our spirit as a people.

These were the main points stressed in a speech that said nothing beyond calling for the trust and loyalty of the American People to support their leaders endeavors to end the war while filling the pockets of the Wall Street industrialists, the fat whores whose capital is worth its weight in human blood. Now we are all aware of the idiots secret, a secret wish which was known to some people already as a just procrastination of a policy, with its supporters still determined to see the end result in political and economic subjugation of the very people and surrounding areas they claim to support.

In order to change the world we've got to understand what's wrong with the world. And then - destroy it. Ruthlessly. This is not cruelty or madness. It is one of the most passionate forms of love. Because what we're fighting is suffering, oppression, humiliation-the immense toll of unhappiness caused by capitalism. And any "love" which does not pit itself against these things is sloppy and irrelevant.

There is no such thing as a polite revolution. That doesn't mean that violence is always the right way...or even that you should necessarily turn up at the next demonstration. (There are other ways of challenging the system.) But it does mean understanding that the privileged will do almost anything- will murder and torture and destroy, will foster ignorance and apathy and selfishness at home and will burn children abroad-rather than hand over their power. What will you do when Apple is as big as Marks and Spencers, and one day its employees decide to take it over and run it for themselves? Will you let them get away with it? Or will you call in the police-because you are a businessman, and businessmen Must Protect Their Interests?

One last thing. You've written some marvelous, honest, beautiful music. (And an indication of the weird effect capitalism has had on you that you felt it was necessary to pretend that in doing so you were only conning people.) But recently your music has lost its bite...The Stones, helped along a bit by their experiences with the law...refuse to accept the system that's fucking up our lives. You did it for a bit when you were taking acid-the only time in your career when you stepped outside the cheeky chappy slot the establishment had slid you into and the time when your music was at its best....

But after all, they still hate you, even if you are a company director. They hate you because you act funny and because you're working-class (in origin at least) and you're undisciplined and you weren't in the army and, above all, you've been going out with a foreigner. So now it's happened....

But learn from it, John. Look at the society we're living in, and ask yourself why? And then-come and join us.

The establishment never slotted us into a "cheeky chappy" bag, dear John- we did-to get here to do what we're doing now. I was there, you

were't. So suddenly the papers told you we were taking acid-two years after the event. So you decided that our music was best then. You're probably right about why they didn't bust me before-they, like you, had me tagged. I'll tell you something-I've been up against the same people all my life-I know they still hate me. There's no difference now-just the size of the game has changed. Then it was school masters, relatives, etc.-now I'm arrested or ticked off by fascists or brothers in endless fucking prose.

Who's upset about (my) arrest? OK, I'll have a cup of tea. I don't worry about what you-the left-the middle-the right or any fucking boy's club think, I'm not that bourgeois.

Look man, I was/am not against you. Instead of splitting hairs about the Beatles or the Stones-think a little bigger-look at the world we're living in, John, and ask yourself: why? And then-come and join us.

Dear John:

It must be nice for you not to be in any boy's clubs.

You're right, though. My letter was patronizing, and maybe some of the things I raised in it were trivial. It's what you say about the more serious ones that I want to deal with. Above all, my point was that we've got to understand that the hangups that emanate largely from the kind of society we live in. Unless you see this you end up blaming it all on nastymen. I think this is much more naive than blaming it on the class war. Yet this is what you do. You say what's wrong with the world is narrow minds, sick heads-people.

That's funny, because we're supposed to be the ones with "minds that hate" who are "on a destruction kick." But we don't blame people, and we wouldn't want to shoot all the capitalists even if they did wear badges, because we think it's natural for them to behave the way they do. What we blame is the form of society which produces them-which by its nature is competitive, puts profit before principle, places power and privilege in the hands of the few at the expense of many, etc. Given such a society a lot of people (rich/poor) are necessarily selfish, narrow-minded, unscrupulous. They have to be. That's the way the system works. Build a better form of society-one based on cooperation and participation and sharing-and people will respond accordingly. And we know this will happen, because we see history moving inexorably towards this kind of society-both in the capitalist countries and in the communist ones.

You talk a lot about sick heads. This also depends on how you look at it. What do you think about a person who's content to sit around being beautiful while the rest of the world burns? What do you think about a person who claims to be concerned about people and their values, but remains silent when confronted by the actual struggles and sufferings of most of the human race? Are they sick too?

Not that I think you're wrong about people needing to straighten their heads out. It's just that in "Revolution" you say that people who want to change institutions should free their minds "instead." Why instead? What makes you so sure that a lot of us haven't changed our heads in something like the way you recommend-and then found out it wasn't enough, because you simply cannot be completely turned on and happy when you know that kids are being roasted to death in Vietnam, when all around you, you see people's individuality being stunted by the system. Why couldn't you have said "as well"-which is what I would say.

You say you sell dreams. So do Cliff Richard and Engelbert Humperdinck. Is it just a question of whose dreams we like best? Or should we start to ask what role these dreams play in people's lives, what they make them do, whether they make them act or go to sleep, whether they're revolutionary dreams or go-to-sleep-and-forget-it-all dreams?

Let me tell you something back. I've been very involved in some of your music. The feeling I've got from songs like "Strawberry Fields" and "A Day in the Life" is part of what has made me into the kind of socialist I am. But then you suddenly went and kicked all that in the face with "Revolution." That was why I wrote to you-to answer an attack you made on us, to criticize a position you took... in relation to the revolutionary

socialist movement - knowing that what you said would be listened to and respected by millions, whereas whatever reply we make is read by only a few thousand.

Now you say that you're not against us after all. Well, that's nice, because I'm certainly not against you. I just wish you were a bit more on our side. (We could do with a few good songs.)

As for who I am - what kind of question is that, for Christ's sake?

What do I know? I know it's possible for us to create a world which could one day become a loving paradise for every human being. Is that thinking big enough for you?
