Much hardship is brought on parents of mentally retarded children by the lack of understanding among average citizens, Miss Elizabeth Smith, senior social worker at Willowbrook State School, told Staten Island's Rotarians yesterday.

She said the public should be more aware that the condition may strike "among the rich as well as the poor," and that "It shows no respect to race, color or creed."

Miss Smith said the birth of a mentally retarded child can have the effect of destroying family solidarity. In all cases, she said, it is a "blow to family life."

Every citizen, she said, has "a stake" in state schools for the mentally retarded, since they are tax-supported and "meet a vital need in the community as a whole."

The speaker was introduced by James J. Mallen, chairman of Rotary's program committee. Borough President Baker was a guest at the meeting, Godfrey H. Car-stens, Rotary president, presided at the session in the Meurot Club.
