Willowbrook State School is not a custodian institution but a means for helping mentally retarded children find their way back to society, Dr. Harold H. Berman, director of the school, said last night.

Speaking at a meeting of the 3nd Ward Republican Club in Republican headquarters, Stapleton, Dr. Berman reported: "Two per cent of babies born are potential candidates for schools like Willowbrook."

He called for preventive and relearch programs to reduce maternal difficulties which often contribute to such births.

Outlines Programs

Among the Willowbrook programs, the speaker said, are a rehabilitation center now teaching 100 children to walk; a school for children too mentally deficient to be accepted by public schools, and a parents' association which raises about \$15,000 annually to provide additional equipment for the school.
