**Willowbrook Plaque  
To Honor Doctor**

A plaque perpetuating the memory of the late Dr. Herbert Schein, staff neuro-psychiatrist and pediatrician at Willowbrook State School, will be unveiled at a ceremony Sunday at 3:30 P.M. in Building 15 at the school.

The plaque will be unveiled under the auspices of the Benevolent Society for Retarded Children, the organization of parents of children at Willowbrook. Dr. Schein died Jan. 30, 1953.

The physician served Willowbrook almost from the time of its inception on April 1, 1948. He has been credited with doing much to improve the morale of parents and children, as well as the school's staff.
