## Plaque Honors State School First Chaplain

A plaque in memory of the Rev. Daniel I. Quinn, first chaplain of Willowbrook State School will be dedicated tomorrow afternoon at 3 o'clock in the auditorium by the Most Rev. Joseph M. Pernicone, auxiliary bishop of the New York Archdiocese.

Father Quinn served at the school for mentally retarded children from 1951 until his death a year ago today.

Other guests expected at the ceremony include Father Quinn's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Quinn; his brother, John, and sister, Catherine, all Bronx residents; C. Ernest Smith, member of the Willowbrook board of visitors; Irving Redlen, vice-president of the Benevolent Society for Retarded Children, and some of Father Quinn's seminary classmates.

Dr. H. H. Berman, director of the school, will unveil the plaque and the Rev. Robert A. Arpie, chaplain of Mount St. Michael, Greenridge, will give the dedication talk. The Willowbrook School band of 40 pieces will play under direction of Vincent and Joseph Lombardi.

AT 11 O'CLOCK tomorrow morning, a first anniversary solemn mass will be offered in the school auditorium, convertible into a chapel. The celebrant will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph F. Connolly, director of Spanish-Catholic Action in the New York Archdiocese.

The deacon will be the Rev. William J. Rinchler of St. Andrew's Church, Manhattan, and the subdeacon the Rev. James Cunningham of the Mission of the Immaculate Virgin, Mount Loretto.

In the sanctuary will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John F. McCarthy, director of the archdiocesan Institutional Commodities Service, and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles M. Walsh, archdiocesan director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine.

The Rev. Benjamin Wasielewski of Holy Innocents Church, Manhattan, will be master of ceremonies. The entire dedication program is in charge of the Rev. Edward J. Banks, Father Quinn's successor as chaplain at Willowbrook.
