State Within Month To Act *

A 3,000-bed mental hospital will be built in the South Beach-Occan Breeze area by the State Department of Mental Hygiene.

This was indicated yesterday by state officials at the second in a series of meetings with city and borough officials in Manhattan, who made it clear that only approval by the governor is needed to make the project official. Governor Harriman is expected to make an announcement to this effect within a month.

According to Borough President Maniscato, the state officials have tentatively selected a 200-acre site for the hospital. A survey has indicated that most of these structures are very old and some have actually been abandoned. Nearly all of those in use are occupied only during the summer, it was said.

Maniscalco said that state officials have pointed out that the marshlands selected for the site cannot serve any useful purpose in their present condition, that the land is so low that it traps drainage water and is a breed-ing place for mosquitoes and other insect pests. They said that the land would probably never be made useful if this opportunity had not presented itself.

MANISCALCO said the officials indicated that the would be acquired and reclamation started within a year. Sand fill pumped from the bay off the beachfront, will be used to raise the grade of the tract several feet.

It was indicated that once the project gets the green light from the governor, efforts will be made to acquire privately-owned land in the site by private sale, that condemnation proceedings will only be initiated as a last resort. By far the greater portion of the land is city-owned, acquired by foreclosure for tax arrears, and title can easily be transferred to the state.

The borough president said the state authorities also said that the hospital will be design-ed and planned to include out-patient treatment for Islanders who may need such service. They have also indicated that some 200 Islanders now in mental hospitals throughout the state, would he transferred to the new hospital so they could be near their

families.
