# Rocky Coming by Plane For Republican Picnic

Gov. Rockefeller will travel to the Island by plane from his Tarrytown estate Sept. 12 to attend the annual picnic of the Republican County Committee at Sea Breeze House, Eltingville.

GOP County Chairman James A. Flood reported today that the governor has arranged to land his plane at Miller Field, New Dorp, shortly before 2 p.m.

He will be met at Miller Field by Flood, the Island's three state legislators, and other officials, and will be taken by car to Willowbrook State School for a brief visit with officials of that institution, and then to Stapleton for an inspection of vacant East Shore piers.

Flood said he confirmed yesterday with the governor's office that Rockefeller will visit the piers in keeping with a request more than a week ago by Assemblyman Edward J. Amann Jr., who is seeking to enlist his aid in stimulating business on the East Shore waterfront.

State Senator John J. Marchi and Assemblyman Lucio F. Russo, as well as Amann, will accompany the governor on the trip.

THE GOVERNOR is due to arrive at the picnic shortly after 3 p.m. and has promised to remain there more than an hour, Flood said. He is due to return to his plane at Miller Field shortly after 4:30 o'clock.

William C. Gaus, chairman of the general committee for the picnic, reported today that more than 7,500 tickets for the affair have been distributed. He predicted an attendance of more than 5,000.

A score of athletic contests will feature the program and many prizes have been donated for the winners, the chairman

said. Games for children will predominate.

A reception committee has been appointed to greet the governor upon his arrival at Sea Breeze House, situated on the east side of Hylan Blvd. at the foot of Arden Ave.

The committee, Gaus said, will include Congressman John H. Ray, County Court Judge James C. Crane, City Court Justice Mark A. Costantino, Municipal Court Justice John J. Kelly, Deputy Commissioner P. Vincent Sullivan of the Motor Vehicles Bureau, John A. Garbarino, Republican designee for district attorney; Mrs. Elizabeth Pouch, member of the GOP State Executive Committee, Mrs. Ethel Caffrey, president of the Women's Republican Club of Staten Island and Mrs. Virginia Gaus.
