

Union Aims Pickets at State School

New York State Employees Council 50, American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, announced last night that Willowbrook State School will be picketed Monday "to focus attention on the anti-union attitude of the administration at this hospital." Willowbrook Local 1184, claiming a membership of more than 300, is a member of the council.

The council's statement said that "the anti-union hostility comes about because of the attitude and the violation of law at the institution by the director.

"The violation of law takes place because the director refuses to recognize the grievance procedure."

DR. JACK HANCOCK, director of the school, last night denied the administration has any anti-union attitude.

Dr. Hancock said the charge that his attitude is anti-union is untrue.

He said that he had arranged an appointment for Al Wurf, executive director of the council, for next Friday at which the union grievances, one of which involves the discharge of a probationary worker will be discussed.

Officials of the Island union were unable to say whether the picketing would be by off-Islanders or union employees at the hospital. The picketing is scheduled to start at 8:30 a.m.
