### Face Court Hearing

Two Willowbrook State School employees had bail set at \$500 on grand larceny charges Thursday when they were arraigned in Criminal Court. A hearing was slated for next Friday.

They are Paul Kempe, 42, of 10907 Richmond Ave., Bulls Head, and William Meisel, 46, of 421 Watchogue Rd., Willowbrook.

The men, both engineers, are accused of stealing brass pipe valued at nearly \$4,000. Police said the pipe was taken from a hot water line which ran through a tunnel from the boiler room to the laundry. It had not been in use for several months.

New York State Employees Council 50, American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, yesterday staged a demonstration at Willowbrook State School "to focus attention on the anti-union attitude of the administration of this hospital."

Dr. Jack Hammond, director of the school, has denied the administration has any anti-union attitude. He said that an appointment had been made with Al Wurf, executive director of the council, at which employee grievances will be discussed.

A council spokesman said that 14 pickets — 10 from locals in other hospitals and 4 members of the executive board of Local 1184, affiliated with the council—marched in front of the school entrance from 6 a.m. until 4 p.m. They were led by Wurf.

The union spokesman said there are no further plans for picketing at present as it is believed that the purpose was achieved yesterday.

### To Get More

### Picketing

New York State Employees Council 10, American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, will put another picket line at Willowbrook State School on Feb. 16, a union official announced last night.

He reported the council had no knowledge of a conference which Dr. Jack Hammond, medical director, said had been scheduled for today to discuss grievances.

Last Monday, 14 pickets paraded in front of the school from 6 a.m. until 4 p.m. "to focus attention on the anti-union attitude of the administration at this hospital."

Al Wurf, executive director of the council, with whom Dr. Hammond was said to have arranged a meeting, notified the Staten Island union officials that no conference will be held.
