New Injection Announced-Doctor Says Disease Can Now Be Conquered

ONE-SHOT PROTECTION

Immunization Also Halts the Need for Gamma Globulin to Ease Side Effects

By HAROLD M. SCHMECK Jr. There is no longer any excuse for the 4,000,000 or more cases of measles that develop yearly

among American children, a specialist said here yesterday. The comment was made by Dr. Saul Krugman of New York The comment was made by Dr. Saul Krugman of New York University School of Medicine during a news conference called to announce the licensing of a new live virus measles vaccine. The vaccine was put on the market yesterday by the Pitman-Moore Division of the Dow Chemical Company, Indianapolis, after authorization by the National Institute of Health.

The news conference was held at the New York Academy of Sciences, 2 East 63d Street.

The first live virus measles vaccine was marketed in March, 1963, by Merck & Co, Late last year two others also became available, one marketed by Eli Lilly & Co, and the other by Philips Roxane, Inc., a subsidiary of Philips Electronics & Pharmaceuticals, Inc.

With several effective vaccines available, Dr. Krugman
said at the news conference
yesterday, 'there really is no
longer any excuse for any child

Dr. Krugman and other
speakers noted that the complications of measies can be
serious and, sometimes, even
fatal.

Brain Damage

Brain Damage
In about one out of every 1,000 cases of measles there is some residual brain damage, the available statistics indicate. Dr. Morton Andelman of the Chicago Department of Health said measles was a more formidable public health problem, in terms of the disability it causes, than polio ever was. The new vaccine, marketed under the trade name Lirugen, is given in one injection that is believed to offer long-term, probably lifetime, immunity. Wholesale price per dose will be \$2, a spokesman said. It has not been found necessary to give gamma globulin with the new vaccine to diminish the frequency of such undesirable side effects as fever or rash, Gamma globulin is often given with the other live virus measles vaccines.

Dr. Krugman, who has done epidemiological studies with the new vaccine, said it gave ex-tremely prompt protection. The incubation period of the virus used in it is shorter than that of the "wild" measles virus, he

the "wild" measles virus, he said.

Therefore a child given the vaccination any time before, or even shortly after, exposure to measles will probably be protected.
