Lab Technologists Study Transfusing

A workshop and seminar for laboratory technologists held yesterday in Staten Island Hospital was attended by 60 technologists and three pathologists from all five boroughs and from New Jersey.

The subject was "Common Crossmatch Problems in Blood Transfusing." It was co-sponsored by the hospital and the Pfizer Diagnostic Department of Charles Pfizer & Co.

The purpose of the seminar was to present new concepts in blood banks and to point out ways to overcome the difficulties in cross-matching, as developed by research laboratories after abstracting materials from hospital sources. George H. Clarke Jr., Pfizer diagnostic consultant for New

Jersey and Staten Island, was the moderator. Dr. Migdalia Arnan, pathologist at the hospital gave the opening address. Miss Julian Mann, manager of professional services at the Pfizer Diagnostics was the demonstrator.
