Sen. Robert F. Kennedy (D., N. Y.) charged today re being kept in virtual snake-pit conditions "in rooms less comfortable and cheerful than the cages in which we out animals in a zoo."

Kennedy said that at one of the institutions—the Wilbrook State School on Staten Island — five patients died unnatural deaths in the past year as a result of "overcrowding and inadequate staffing."

"One patient was burned in a shower by another re tarded patient," said Kennedy. "Another boy, a low-func tioning retardate, was killed by an older, more capable boy who was put in with the slower boys as punishment.

At both Willowbrook and a state school at Rome,
