## New Issue In Albany -Retarded

Gov. Rockefeller and Democratic leaders clashed to-day over the problem of providing funds to improve conditions for the mentally retarded in state institutions.

Majority leaders in the Legislature called on the Governor to double the number of attendants in the under-staffed institutions. Emergency funds were available, they sa'd, if he would only ask for them.

Angered by the implication that he was dragging his heels in the face of a Democratic call for a "crash program" to cope

with the problem. Rockefellet last night called the proposal "shockingly hypocritical."

He said the Democrats last winter cut \$3,500,000 in operat-ing funds from his budget for the Dept. of Mental Hygiene.

"A million and half of that was for more attendants, nurses and doctors for care of the mentally retarded," the Governor remarked.

Rockefeller also said, in a letiter released before his reply to
the Democrats, that a master
plan he recommended in 1962 for
treating the mentally ill had
been "so outstanding" that President Kennedy had used it as a
blueprint for a federal program
presented to Congress.

The letter was to Drs. George
L. Wadsworth and Alan D. Milter of the State Planning Committee on Mental Disorder.

The issue of the mentally retarded burst into headlines last

## Urges 'Crash Program'

In a telegram sent yesterday to Rockefeller, State Sen. Harry Kraf (D-Bronx), chairman of the Joint Legislative Committee on Mental Retardation, said: "I am certain that you, like the entire citizenry of New York State, have been shocked by the revelations."

Kraf called on the Governor to start a "crash program" that would include the following proposals:
"Double the number of attendants, particularly for the severely retarded.
"Accede to the specific requests of the various directors of our stare schools for additional occupational speech and phycial therapists and other professional personnel.
"Institute a crash program for the removal of odors at the schools."

## Planning Committee Program

A program outlined over the weekend by the State Planning Committee on Mental Disorders would expand mental health facilities by 40 per cent during the next decade.

The report to Rockefeller rec-ommended a network of 150 mental health centers through-out the state, and 30 mental re-lardation centers.
