Rockefeller said the Mental Hygiene Department had been requested to submit by Dec. I its recommendations for obtaining facilities in the New York City area that could be adapted for care of the retarded at a reasonable cost.

He said the department had begun searching more than a year ago for such facilities.

The governor said the opening of the Suffolk State School on Friday would help relieve overcrowding at Willowbrook. The Suffolk institution will have ecapacity of 2,800. Rockefeller also commented that the needs of Willowbrook would receive "every consideration" in the 1966-67 state budget, which now is being prepared

By all accounts, the care given retarded children housed at Gouverneur Hospital is good.
