Suit Trial Nears End

A \$500,000 negligence suit against the state by the parents of a 6-year-old retarded boy who allegedly died of malnutrition in 1962, after spending 13 days in Willowbrook State School, came closer to disposition yesterday, as final briefs were being readied for submission

As the three-day trial in the Court of Claims ended yester-day, Herman B. Glaser, attorney for Mr. and Mrs. James Anderson of Selden, L. I., referred to staffing as a major problem of the Staten Island state school.

Selden claims his son, Edward, died as a result of negligence by the institution's staff.

Glaser maintained during the trial that the child was injured in a fall and had developed a respiratory infection. When Anderson visited his son in April, 1962, the father stated, he "appeared to be on the verge of death."

Anderson subsequently secured a release for his son.
Within minutes after young
Edward was taken home, he
died.
