Mayor Lindsay acted yes terday to expand the city's help for the mentally retarded by establishing 'a committee of psysicians, educators, state and city officials and civic leaders "to develop a complete range of essential programs in each of the city's five boroughs."

The committee will make its recommendations on improving present services directly to the Mayor. It will work closely with Dr. Howard J. Brown, Health Services Administrator, and be guided by, but not confined to, suggestions by the City's mental Health Planning Committee and the State Planning Committee on Mental Disorders.

Head of the committee is Mrs. Robert M. Blum, member of the Community Mental Health Board. The committee will be divided into four subcommittees - Clinical, Education, Government and Citizens.
