By RONALD MAIORANA Special to The New York Times ALBANY, Jan. 10-Senator Seymour R. Thaler charged on the floor of the Senate today that municipal and state hospitals in New York City were performing medical experiments on indigents patients without their consent.

Senator Thaler, who said he had "searched his soul and conscience," made the following charges in an angry hour-long speech:

¶Willowbrook State Hospital on Staten Island "took 500 mentally retarded children, \$ to 9 years old, and injected them with a live hepatitis virus because officials wanted to start a hepatitis research programme

¶A 23-year-old woman at Harlem Hospital recently under went a hysterectomy without her consent to demonstrate the operative procedure to internes and residents.

Harlem Hospital provide therapy for youngsters with congenitally deformed limbs except when internes and residents are being taught surgical procedure - then the children are sent to surgery for removal of the limbs."
