Department Head Named At Retardation Institute

ALBANY — Dr. Paul Greengard, formerly director of the Department of Biochemistry at the Geigy Research Laboratories in Ardsley, N.Y., has been appointed to the State Institute for Basic Research in Mental Retardation in Willowbrook.

Dr. Greengard will be the director of the department of neuropharmacology at the institute.

Currently Dr. Greengard is a visiting associate professor in the pharmacology department at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Yeshiva University, where he is conducting his research until the laboratories are completed at the institute.

In making the announcement, Mental Hygiene Commissioner

Alan K. Miller said, "The \$12 million research institute, conceived primarily as a means of systematically investigating the causes of mental retardation, will coordinate, concentrate and expand the Department of Mental Hygiene's research efforts in this field."
