

Students find nurse training a practical venture

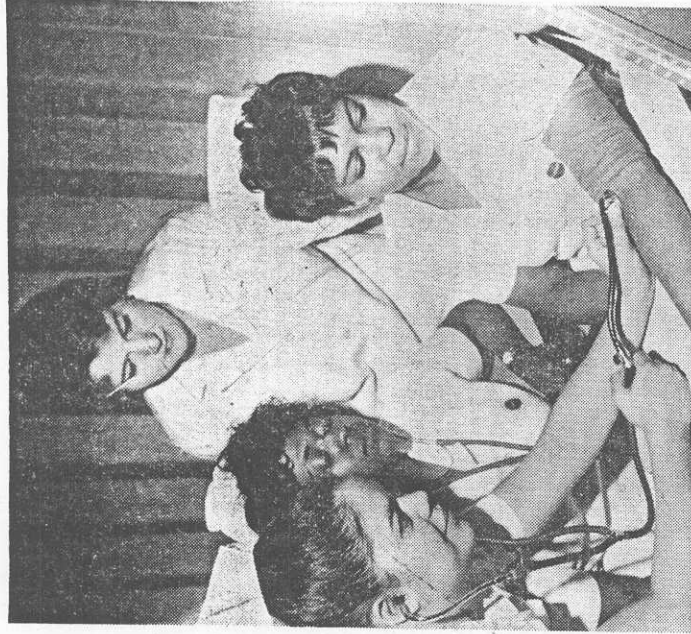
