

Parents to receive dead GI's medals

Ernest P. Palcic, an Army paratrooper who was killed in Vietnam Jan. 24, 1968, has been posthumously awarded the Bronze Star Medal for heroism and a Purple Heart Medal. The medals will be presented to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ernest C. Palcic, during a 9:30 a.m.

The couple will be presented with a lectern donated by employees of Willowbrook and the Benevolent Society for Retarded Children in their son's memory.

The two groups also will present the school's Protestant chaplain, the Rev. Arnold Ostlund, with communion wear and a case set. Rabbi Phillip Goldberg, Jewish chaplain, will receive a perpetual light.

Their son worked at Willowbrook will attending Port Richmond High School and after his graduation in 1966. He enlisted in the Army in January 1967.
