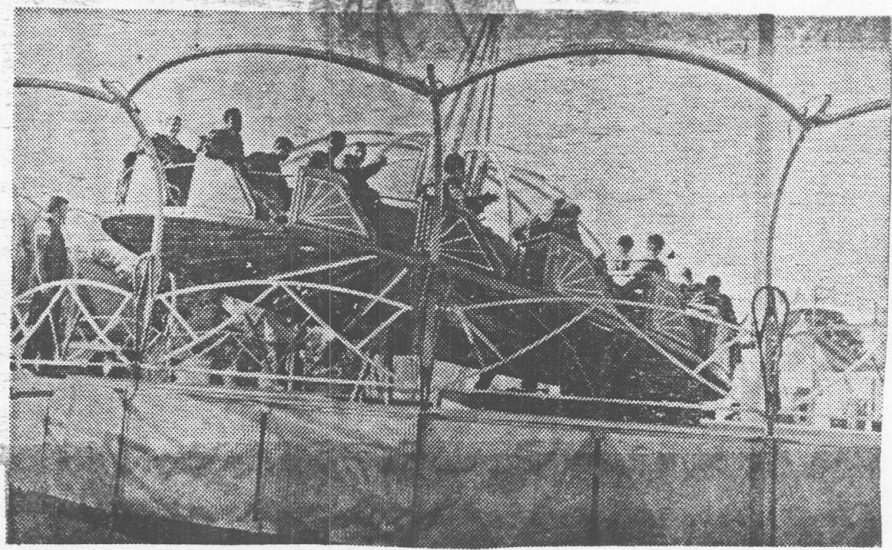


Carnival Cheers Retarded Kids

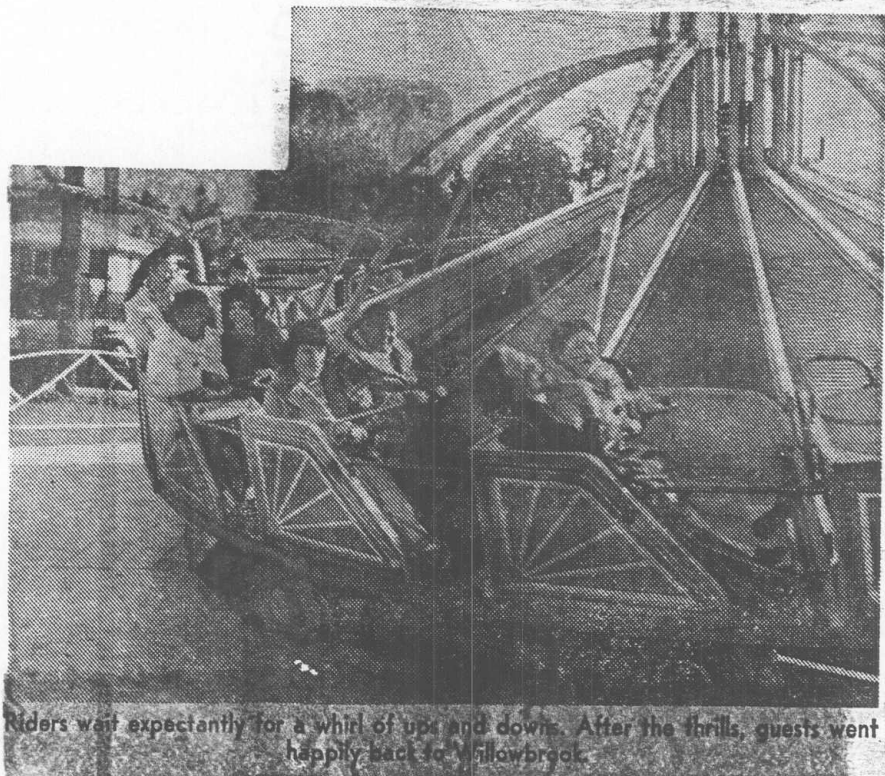
