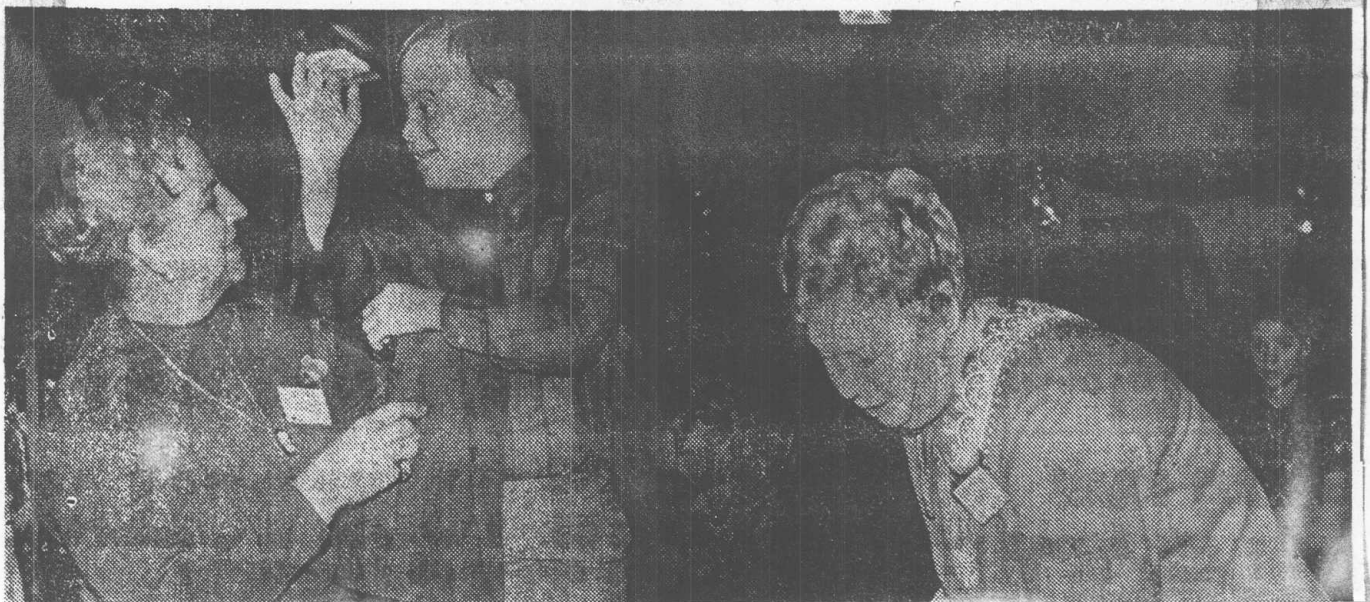


Performing a special service
