

Ettlinger named Chamber head

Carlton H. Ettlinger, a professional land surveyor, was elected president of the Staten Island Chamber of Commerce yesterday, at a board meeting in the Staaten, West Brighton. He succeeds Adam Antenucci, general manager of the Consolidated Edison Co's Staten Island division, and takes office Jan. 1.

Ettlinger is president of his own land surveying firm, which has been in business in St. George since 1913, and of Ettlinger and Procassini Inc., consulting engineers and city surveyors.

At the meeting yesterday, the new president promised that the Chamber would give special attention "to additional police protection for the Island, revision of the City Charter to bring more control for our community's needs to Borough Hall, and acceleration of transportation improvements, with emphasis on the West Shore Expressway and Richmond Parkway.

Elected to serve with Ettlinger are James E. Reynolds Jr., president of the Reynolds Shipyard Corp.; Ambrose L. Gillon Jr., president of the Richmond County Federal

Savings and Loan Association; Jerome S. Berg, president of the Eastern Coast Lighting and Electrical Supply Co., and Guy Molinari, attorney, all vice presidents.

Albert Torrone, president of the Torrone Paint Store Inc., was elected secretary - treasurer. Richard B. Irwin was reelected executive vice president and Thomas A. Bruno reappointed general counsel.

Founded in 1895, the Chamber has 500 members in business and professional fields.
