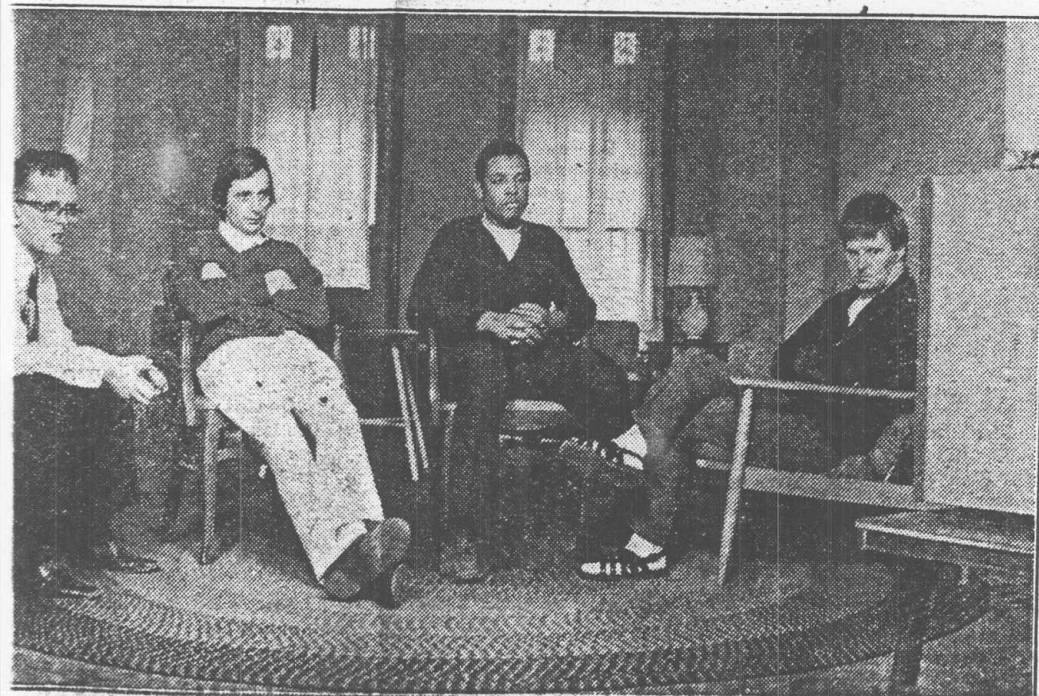

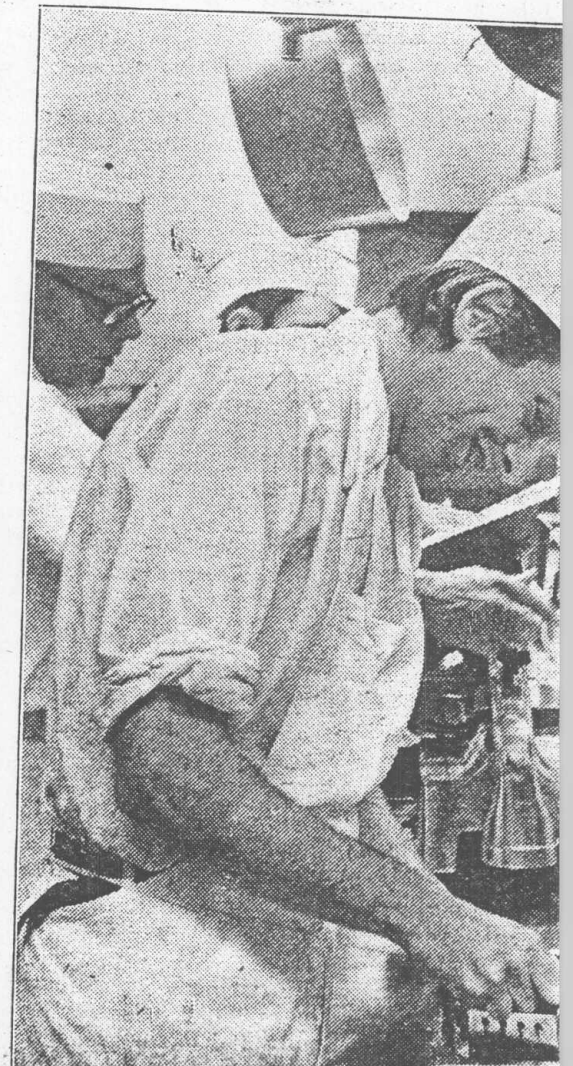

Someone Cares About Fred Rossi

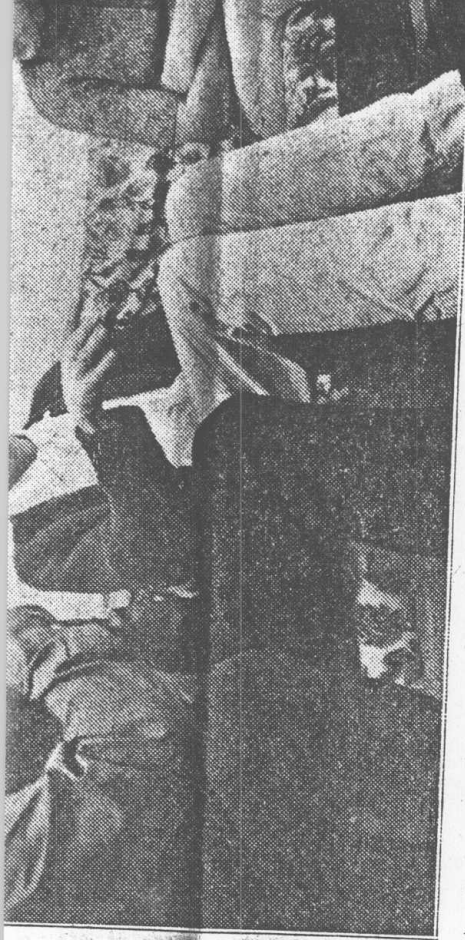
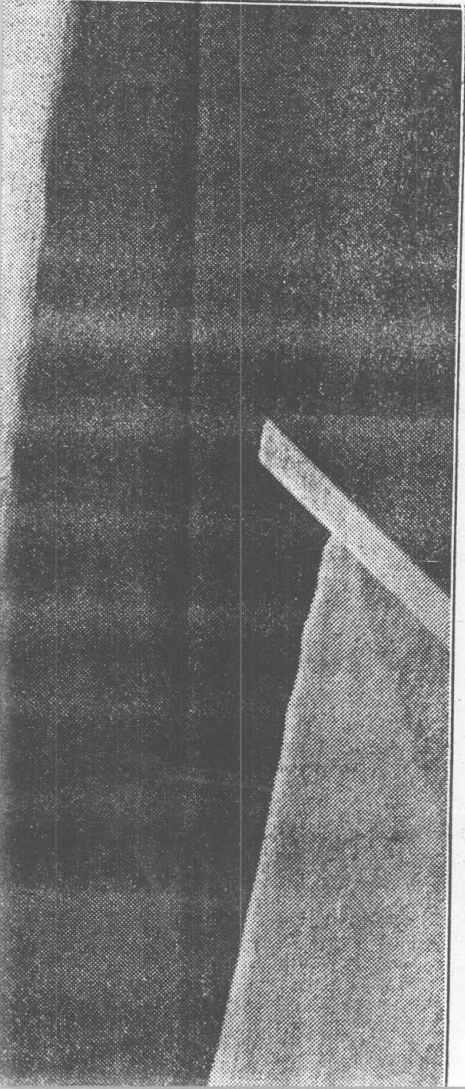

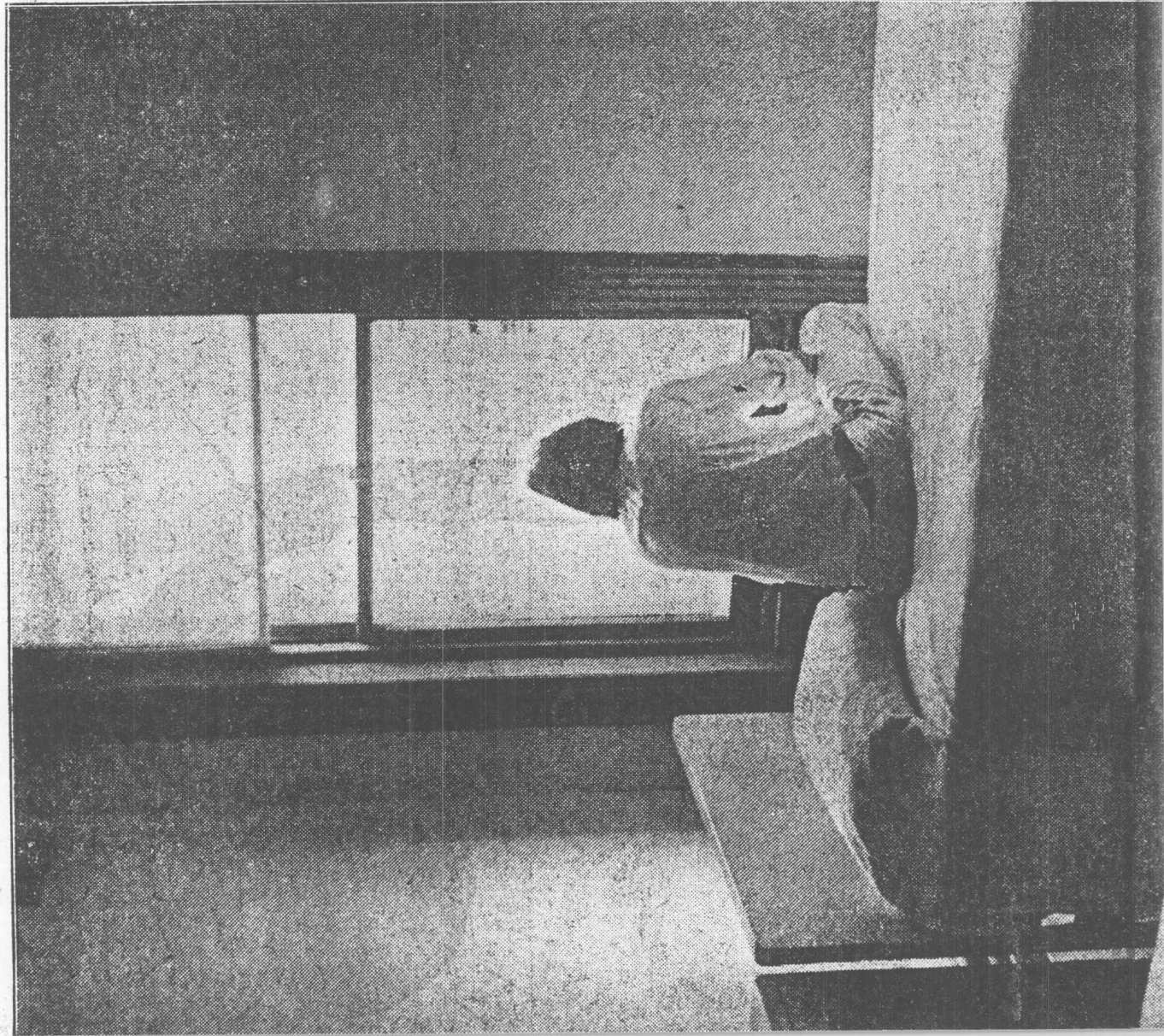
