Rapping what he called the "widespread" use of nursing and proprietary care homes for older mental patients or retarded persons, Burden claimed that such institutions "don't provide adequate psychiatric care." He urged the establishment of 's pecifically designed rehabilitation centers and halfway houses adopted to the specific needs of the mentally ill and mentally retarded."

Yesterday's hearing kicked off a committee investigation that will result in specific recommendations, Burden said. The next hearing, which is yet to be scheduled, will focus on the plight of mental patients in proprietary homes, welfare hotels and nursing homes.

Representatives of the city Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, the state Department of Mental Hygiene, the Department of Social Services and several individual treatment programs attended yesterday's hearing.
