

No new leads on missing woman

Police and Willowbrook Developmental Center officials yesterday reported no new leads or solid information on the whereabouts of a 28-year-old Willowbrook resident who has been missing since Saturday.

Willowbrook officials and the missing woman's relatives have dispersed approximately 4,000 flyers, asking for help of Manhattan residents in finding the woman.

Flyers have also been hand-

ed out in strategic locations in all five boroughs. There is a possibility, officials report, that the woman, Marguerite Sass, may have boarded a train while in Manhattan.

She was lost while 32 Willowbrook residents were attending a concert at Carnegie Hall Saturday afternoon.

Despite several calls to police from people who apparently spotted the woman, Saturday and Sunday night, police reportedly have no new

solid leads on where Miss Sass may be.

Joyce Libra, who was appointed search coordinator by Acting Director James A. Forde, says that she is still optimistic that Miss Sass will be found "in relatively good condition."

Eleven Willowbrook officials have voluntarily been searching the area around Carnegie Hall for the past few days.
