# DMH to begin 'real overhaul'

The state Department of Mental Hygiene will begin implementing a major reorganization plan "within the month" with the help of two nationally prominent corporate executives, it was learned Tuesday.

The plan will involve creation of new offices, top executive positions and the possible elimination of posts currently held by high-level DMH employees, said Dr. Kevin Cahill, Gov. Hugh L. Carey's special assistant for health affairs.

Thomas J. Watson Jr., former chairman

of the board of the IBM Corporation, and Arthur B. Krim, chairman of the board of United Artists Corp., "will look at the reorganization plan, help recruit and work with (DMH Commissioner Dr. Lawrence

C. Kolb) and myself in looking at both the positions and the candidates," Cahill said.

Cahill said the reorganization plan is designed to "create accountability at every level" and that decisions made by Watson, Krim and a committee they will

direct "are going to be reflective of the administration of Hugh Carey."

Indicating the possibility that some high DMH officials may lose their current posts, Cahill said Watson and Krim will look at existing positions "to see whether those are the best people..."

Cahill asserted the plan constitutes a "real overhaul" and that it will involve, as Kolb indicated in July, creation of new offices of health services, internal management and social rehabilitation. There is also a provision in the plan for having

deputy commissioners for planning, administration and clinical services serve under Kolb, he said.

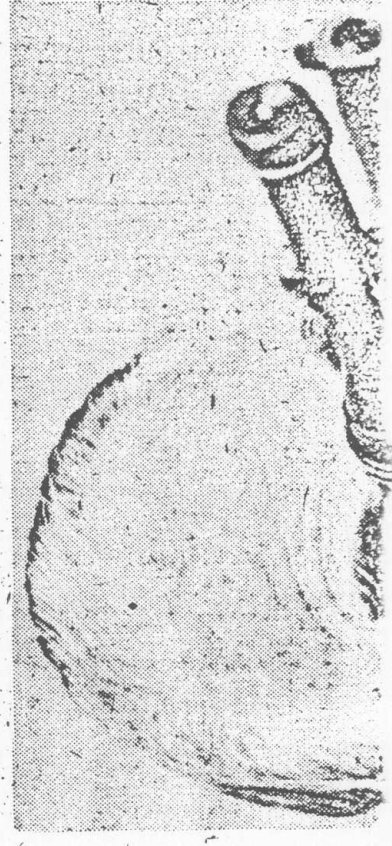
Other details of the plan are expected to be announced by the governor.

Watson and Krim were asked to help in order to give a "fresh look at this," Cahill said. Neither man will be paid, he said.

A DMH spokesman said the Mental Hygiene Council, Kolb's official citizens advisory group, will assist Kolb, Cahill, Watson and Krim.

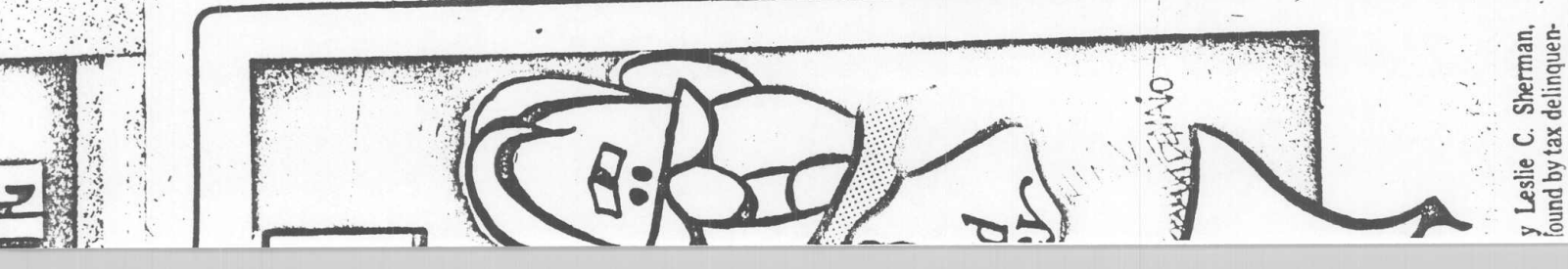
