No bail for suspect in fatal beating

Willie Summers was ordered held without bail when arraigned yesterday in the Supreme Court on an indictment charging him with second degree murder in the fatal beating of a 76-year-old New Dorp tailor during an alleged mugging on the ferryboat J.F. Kennedy last Oct. 12.

An innocent plea was entered on behalf of Summers, 24, of 18 Arlington Ave., Mariners Harbor.

Summers, a former resident of Willowbrook Developmental Center, was arraigned before Justice Theodore G. Barlow, who put the case over to today and transferred it to Justice John A. Garbarino, before whom Summers has a robbery case pending.

The tailor, Nicola Infantino of 102
Winham Ave. died in a hospital 10 days
after he was found beaten in the ferryboat's men's room. Police said a wallet
and other items had been stolen from
the victim.
