

How legislators voted

ALBANY — Here is how Staten Island legislators voted on some of the bills acted on last week:

SENATE — A bill to permit parents to take their children out of sex education classes. Passed 42 to 13 with Marchi voting yes.

A bill to require doctors to give the parents at least five days notice before performing an abortion on a girl under 18 years old. Passed 40 to 16 with Marchi voting yes.

A bill authorizing the compensation to Triborough Bridge and Tunnel Authority policemen for the time it takes them to process an arrest. Passed 53 to 1 with Marchi voting yes.

A bill to require Department of Men-

tal Hygiene officials to develop a uniform system for the reporting of incidents for mental retardation and psychiatric facilities. Passed 54 to 0 with Marchi present.

A bill requiring that all new lights installed in schools be of the safety type that self-extinguish when cracked. Passed 53 to 1 with Marchi voting yes.

ASSEMBLY — A bill imposing minimum and maximum prison sentences on violent felons and restricting plea bargaining. Passed 141 to 0 with all Island members present.

A bill to setting standards for the marketing of wine and cider so the one can't be sold as the other. Passed 138 to 0 with all Island members present.
