Your article also left its readers with the impression that Anthony rarely leaves the Staten Island Developmental Center to visit home. This, too, is untrue. Anthony spends more time at home than in the Staten Island Developmental Center. He comes home at least every other week for a full week, and many times even longer. He is by no means neglected.

Although there were a number of other inaccuracies in the article which also disturbed us, in the interests of time and space, we will not elaborate on them here.

We would appreciate your rectifying the inaccuracies outlined above by printing this letter in your paper.
