

Man, 19, sentenced to six months

A 19-year-old New Brighton man accused of threatening a Staten Island Developmental Center out-patient at knife-point Oct. 3 was sentenced yesterday to six months in jail in Stapleton Criminal Court.

The jail term was imposed on Stephen Wynn of 217 Hamilton Ave. after Wynn pleaded guilty to a charge of unlawful imprisonment. Police said Wynn held 24-year-old Armando Gonzales at knife-point in his Stapleton apartment during a dispute over money. When police officers arrived on the scene, they kicked in the door and found Wynn standing behind the door with the knife in his hand.

Police were summoned when a Willowbrook employee arrived at Gonzalos' apartment to escort him to the develop-

mental center.

In other court action yesterday, a 19-year-old Elizabeth, N.J., youth was fined \$100 after pleading guilty to disorderly conduct on Sept. 29. David Danish and another New Jersey teenager were arrested that night near the Goethals Bridge when police spotted them walking from a car that had been stolen in New Jersey.

Also yesterday, a 17-year-old Eltingville youth, Peter Manganiello of 630 Barlow Ave., was sentenced to three years probation after pleading guilty to criminal mischief last July 31, when he was arrested for allegedly turning on several fire hoses inside of Farrell's Ice Cream Parlor in the Staten Island Mall New Springville, causing extensive damage inside the restaurant.
