Policemen find missing patient

The search for Louis Rodriguez was headed by Capt. William L. Johnson of the 123rd Precinct, Tottenville, who supervised 10 police officers and volunteer personnel from the center. It covered 3,200 acres. A helicopter search was also conducted.
