## Bedroom fire is doused

A bedroom fire in the Staten Island Developmental Center, Willowbrook, was declared suspicious yesterday.

The fire in Building 33 at 2760 Victory Blvd., erupted in a second floor bedroom of the 275-by-50-foot two-story brick structure at 9:38 a.m., officials said.

The cause of the fire that caused heavy damage to the contents of the room and light damage to the building was not immediately known, officials said. The fire was declared suspicious, however, because there have been several fires in that building in recent months, according to a spokesman for the 22nd Battalion.

Firemen from two engine companies and two ladder companies fought the blaze for 70 minutes, officials said. Firemen Paul Malkin of Ladder Company 86 and a Princes Bay resident, was placed on sick report after being treated for an injury to his wrist in St. Vincent's Medical Center, officials said.
