## Retarded need help, not

Staten Island Developmental Cenater was known around the world as Willowbrook a decade ago, and conditions then were horrifying.

Beset by congressional investigations, adverse national publicity and a series of suits filed by the parents of residents, state officials undertook to bring the facility into the 20th Century.

No more business as usual, they promised. No more subhuman conditions for our most helpless citizens.

But conditions at the center today are "appalling," says U.S. Health and Human Services Commissioner Mar-

conditions and excessive use of drugs to control patients.

State officials say Heckler's charges are based on dated information and that reforms are under way.

That's what they said 10 years ago. Heckler's latest charges come in the wake of a decision by HHS to strip. \$56.8 million in Medicaid funds from the state because of deficiencies in five other state schools.
