CAMPUS PLAN TO BE UNVEILED

The master plan for the consolidation of The College of Staten Island at Willowbrook will be presented to the Committee of 100 for Public Higher Education on Staten Island and The Friends of the College of Staten Island today, at 4:30 p.m., in the ninth-floor Conference Room on the St. George Campus, 120 Stuyvesant Place.

Edmond Volpe, the president of the College of Staten Island, will make the presentation of the plan for the new campus to be constructed on the Willowbrook site, which, upon its completion in 1990, will unify the two existing campuses now located at St. George and Sunnyside.

The new campus is designed to accommodate 8,000 full-time students and is expected to include a new theater, library, health facilities, recreational areas, and 353,000 square feet of instructional space.

Plans are still being worked out as to the exact acreage of land the college will get out of the 330-acre Willowbrook site.

At first, it was anticipated that the institution would ask for 90 acres, but when introducing the plan earlier this year to the press, Volpe announced that the college was hoping to get in the neighborhood of 110 acres.

Also included in the campus design are open spaces, walkways, parking facilities, recreational areas, landscaping, and proposed reconditioning of existing structures.

Once adopted by the City University Board of Trustees, the master plan will serve as the development guide for the consolidated campus.

The firm of Edward Durell Stone, architects, was chosen to design the plan.
