The search for Jennifer will resume today through local police and volunteer efforts. Wallace said police will concentrate on Willowbrook Park.

The search will continue tomorrow, although the location of that search is not yet known. Wallace said he will determine tomorrow's site on the basis on today's progress.

somewhat hopeful," he said. Armed with insect repellent, 17 off-duty National Guard volunteers and about an equal number of police officers searched dense brush areas and the abandoned Farm Colony area in Willowbrook.

"We really want to find this little girl," said Capt. Richard Naccio of the National Guard.

Merle Steiner, a 60-year-old accounting manager for New York Telephone and co-worker of Kenneth Schweiger, has been involved in the search for three days and spent the morning searching wooded areas.

"It's very dense in there. Nothing has been in there for years," he said. "It's very frustrating and disappointing. You keep thinking that hopefully you'll find her."

A new dog was also used in the search of SIDC's Building 2, the largest building in the complex.
