## Retardation group to host resource fair for families

The Staten Island Retardation and Disabilities Council is hosting a Family Support Resource Fair May 15 in the Elizabeth Connelly Resource Center, Willowbrook.

Workshop C will be from 12:15 to 1 p.m. It will include a discussion of the use and effectiveness of Applied Behavioral Analysis, real-life perspectives on community inclusion and the importance of emotional support and specialized family training.

Refreshments will be available and a light lunch will also be served.
