The following was sent to State Sen. John J. Marchi:

"I am writing on behalf of the 285 Management Confidential employees who reside in your district and whose salary increases are being held up by the failure of the Senate and Assembly to pass the same M/C Pay Bill. We need your proven leadership to resolve the deadlock to pass the M/C Pay Bill and urge that it be done when the Senate returns to Albany . . .
