

# Condo withdraws in disabled case

## Managers had opposed new tenants

The board of managers of a Tompkinsville condominium has withdrawn its opposition to a group's plans to move disabled persons into seven apartments, it was learned yesterday.

The board of the Imperial Towers Condominium, 55 Austin Pl., gave no explanation for its decision to withdraw its proceeding in the Supreme Court, said Geoffrey Long, a lawyer for On Your Mark Inc. The group provides recreational and support services for individuals with disabilities.

The board moved in court to challenge a March 21 agreement between On Your Mark and Imperial Towers Associates and its head, Max Kadin, in which the Kadin organization leased the apartments for a year. The lease included a one-year option for On Your Mark to buy the units.

On Your Mark said the apartments will be occupied by individuals with moderate disabilities who are able to care for themselves. Most will be employed. The organization will help them to manage the apartments and their income.
