## CSI employee Dies After Cop Bust on Campus

*Delayed Response Leaves Students Scrambling for Information*

November 29th at approximately 1:00 P.M., a college employee identified as Cory Holmes, 39, died from cardiac arrest at Staten Island University Hospital shortly after suffering a heart attack on campus.

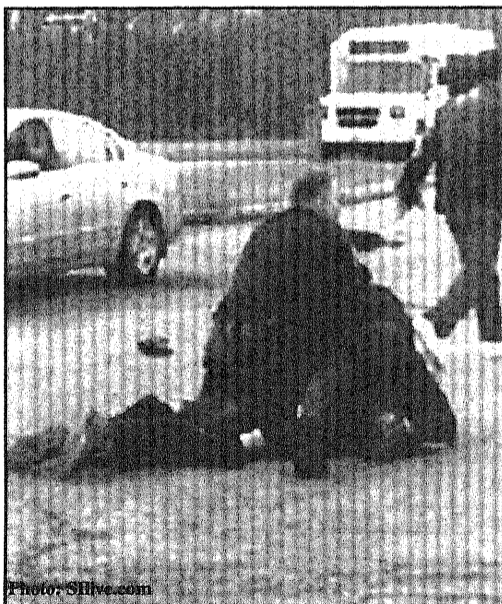
Holmes, a cafeteria worker was discovered smoking marijuana within one of the North Area bathrooms by an off duty Staten Island police officer. In an attempt to arrest a fleeing Holmes, the officer tackled the employee, leading to a skirmish that caused Holmes' heart attack. Events following the apprehension of Holmes remain unclear however.

"As the two wrestled, Holmes tried to swipe a gun from the officer's holster," a police source told the New York Daily News. According to the source, during the struggle, the pistol's slide pulled back and a live bullet popped out of the chamber.

Eager to relieve the situation CSI released a statement, reproduced, that insisted Holmes died from events that did not involve any shooting. The statement was delivered via email through CSI's CIX email service and also posted on CSI web page.

"Early this afternoon, an incident between an off-duty employee of the College of Staten Island Auxiliary Services and a member of the NYPD has

## Morales Defends His Salary

*Students ask President to forfeit 50,000 dollar pay increase*

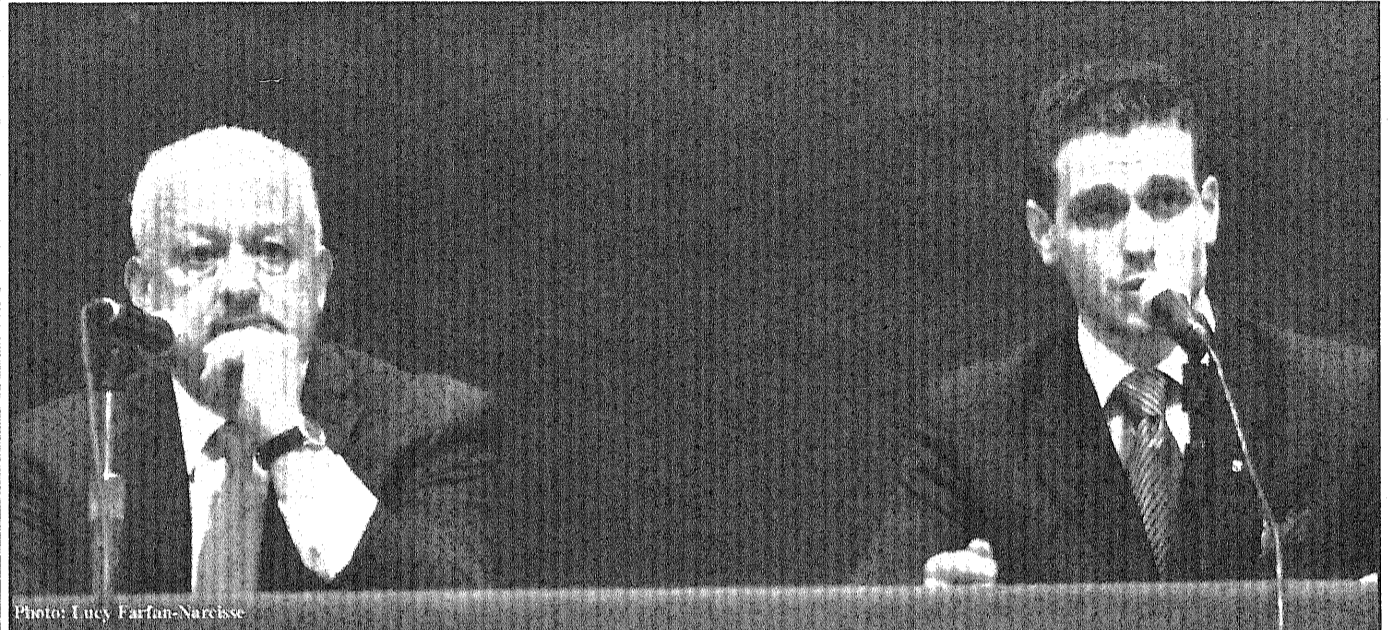

President Morales and Student Government President, Kevin Storberg sat on the stage at 1P's Lecture Hall to answer questions posed from the Student Body. Morales' salary became the topic of interest, dominating the majority of the meeting.

Jesse Franklin and members of CSI's Libertarian Party questioned President Morales at a formal board meeting about the future of CSI with the impending tuition hike and the increase in the student body.

"We will work hard to promise that our students are not affected by the tuition hikes," Morales said. "It is my personal commitment to ensure that no student at CSI will be hurt by

tuition."

On December 8th, President Morales and Student Government President, Kevin Storberg sat on the stage at 1P's Lecture Hall to answer questions posed from the Student Body.

Franklin also questioned the issue of funding for CSI's World Class Education declaring that many students today are forced to look for over tallies in classes to fit their general and major specific requirements.

"The fact is that there are students who

still cannot get into a CORE 100 class because there are not enough professors available and CSI does not have the money to hire more," said Franklin.

Before President Morales could respond to the statistic, Franklin addressed the President's salary questioning the pay increase Morales received three years ago despite only having been hired a year prior. "Would you be open to donate your raise to pay for 2 more adjunct professors?" Franklin asked Morales.

## Student Government Leads Fight to Bring MTA on Campus

*After Years of Campaigning, Petition Begins to Grow Legs*

The Student Government along with members of the college community have begun to take steps to bring the MTA buses onto campus to pick up and drop off students at a more convenient location.

The s62 currently drops students off in the front of the College of Staten

Island campus, a location that requires students to walk a lengthy distance to where their class is held. The loop bus does bring students further into the campus, however students have complained that it is always over crowded.

The bus service in the summer is also a cause for concern.

"During summer classes, the MTA bus stops outside of the campus and students have to cross the street," noted the Student Government vice president, Jesse Rodriguez, "It is very dangerous."

Rodriguez explains that the Student

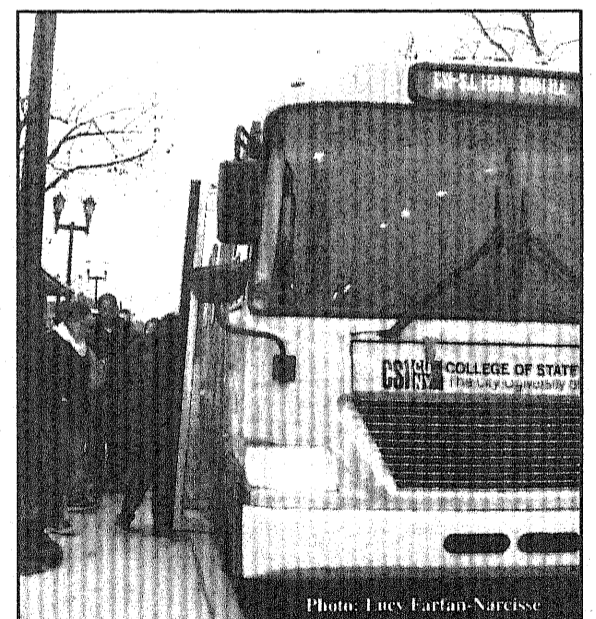

One complaint I keep hearing about the Occupy Wall Street protesters is that many people do not agree with them calling all of the cops terrible. Besides one of the most worthless criticisms one can bring to a protest

To quote U.S. Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis, "Sunlight is the best disinfectant." The idea behind that is that when covered in shadow corruption, abuse and rot fester and only by baring it to the public view can one avoid it, this idea has been lost by the NYPD who at this point is not a civil police force and more a gendarmerie, a

The militarization of the police in America should be something that worries us all. The fact that the NYPD used military grade weaponry on the protesters, banned the

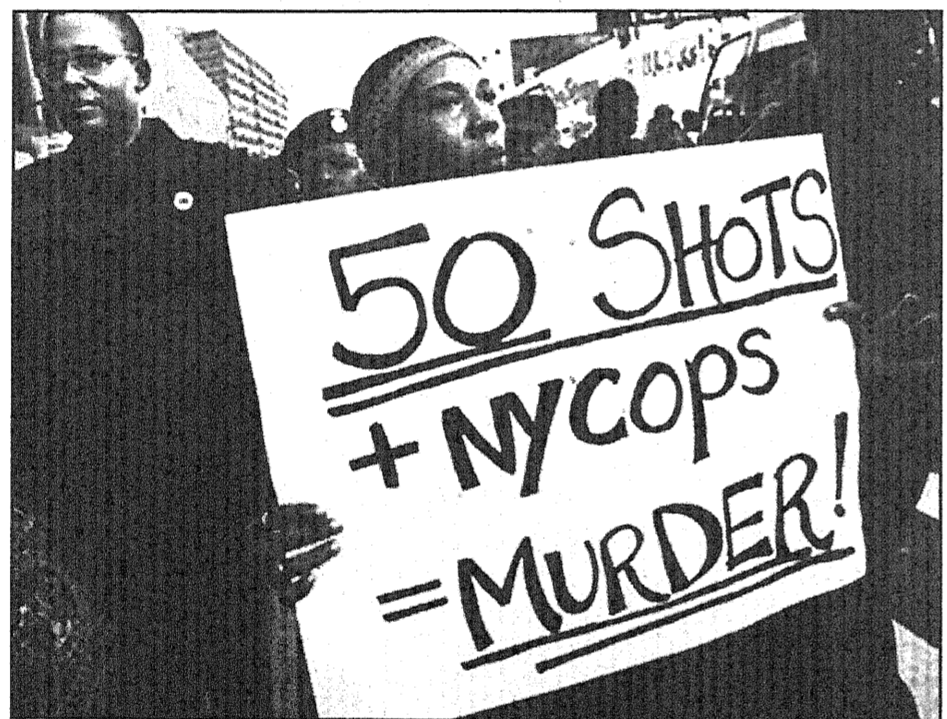
paramilitary force. This is something that should worry us all, for a democracy cannot survive under an authoritarian regime no matter how light it may be at the time.

Outside the meeting, CSI students still trying to obtain their needed classes complained about the extreme competition in registration.

"I'm frustrated. I can't sign up for any of my classes because I need to get over-talies for nearly all of them," said Jeff Feng, a freshman signing up for the spring semester.

Within the hallways of 1P, Franklin summed up his opinion on Morales' response.

However upon questioning Franklin for the sources of his statistics concerning Morales' benefits, he had no response.

Morales addressed the students, stating that role of president is 24/7, and his wife works on behalf of the college and she is unpaid.

"I have made a commitment to serve as the president," Morales told the crowd. "If I believed taking a temporary pay cut would help CSI, I would."

The statement went unannounced for several hours leading to speculation amongst the student body. "This is the new thing, you smoke weed and you get killed. Cops kill people who smoke pot now," said Jay, a senior at CSI who rapped on Holmes death at Open Mike Night in IC.

President Morales later sent out a message that offered condolences to the griev-

State's NY-Alert notification system, was not activated as there was no ongoing or continuing threat to persons or property," Morales stated.

Still, majority of the Student Body agreed that it would have been more reasonable to offer better information than keep them in the dark to form dangerous rumors.

Government is wishes to plan their course of action through the administration, waiting to see their stance on it.

"We are looking for their support. They seem to be receptive," Rodriguez commented.

A lawyer has already been spoken to who has previously worked on a similar case, however, they would rather settle on an agreement with the MTA.

"We are going to lobby the new MTA chair and see where his feelings lie," Rodriguez explained, "We want the MTA to work with us."

The current request is for the s62 to make just one stop on campus preferably in front of 1P, which marks the center of campus.

NY 1 quoted Student Government president Kevin Storberg weighing in on the matter.

"Getting to class on time is a nuisance when you're taking the bus especially because the bus does not drop you off in the middle of campus, it drops you off all the way at the outskirts. That additional transfer can mean the difference between you being half an hour late to a final or you being there on time or even early."

Vice President for Finance and Administration, Ira Persky, explained at a panel discussing CSI's budget that there are four vehicles on campus that have separate contracts. These vehicles are the transportation for the athletic team, the disability service, the loop bus and the shuttle.

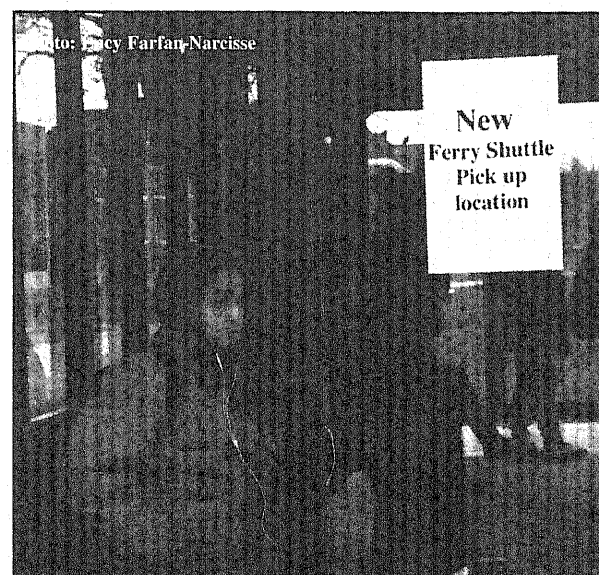

If the MTA does come onto the campus, then the service of the loop bus may no longer be needed.

"I think there is a benefit. I can't help but think that in the final analysis we are going to see a fairly big reduction of those costs," Persky explained referring to the costs of running all four vehicles.

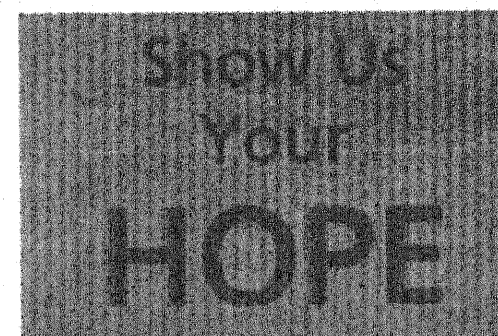
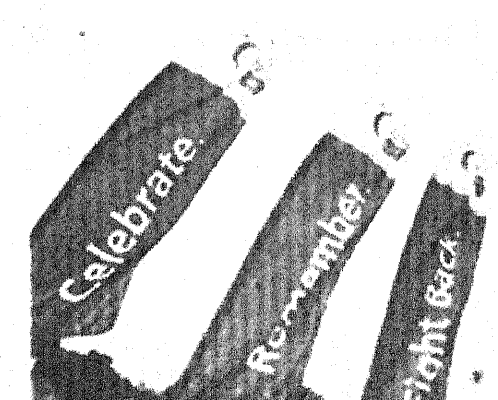
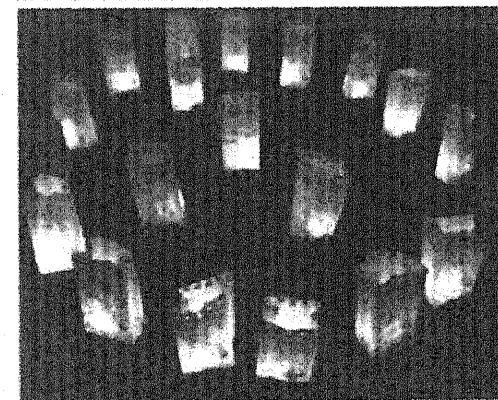
President Morales also commented on the future of the loop bus.

"I think if the MTA does drop off students in the center of the campus we will look at whether we still need a loop bus. Right now we are spending about \$300,000 on the loop bus," he explained.

This motion is still in its preliminary steps, but there are high hopes that there will be success in bringing s62 onto campus by Fall 2012.

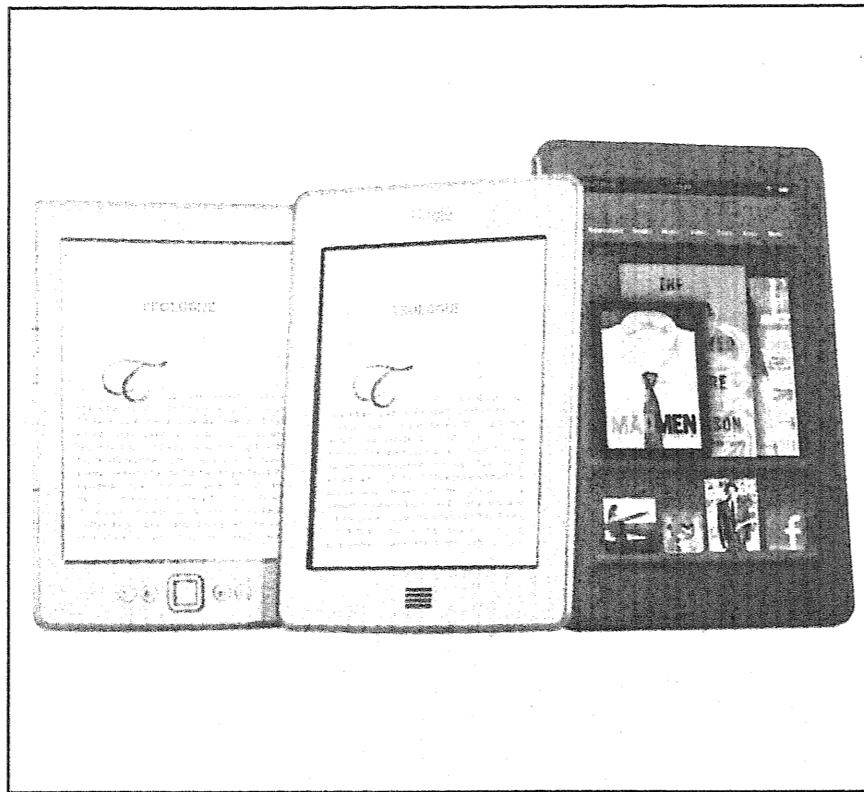

What appeared to be college freshman and sophomores, judging by their backpacks and the way they traveled in groups, began filtering into the lobby of Ip on December 1st at about 7:15pm. This makes sense; *Duet* was being performed by CSI's Drama Program of the Department of Performing and Creative Arts and was worth one, precious and much needed CLUE credit.

The theatre lab was small and dimly lit. The audience was made up of friends and family of the cast members which gave the crowded space a more familial feel. Student Erica DeJulio directed *Duet*, a series of scenes dealing with the emotional issues within romantic relationships, for her senior project. Although this was her first directing endeavor, she has appeared in several other CSI productions, including *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, where her role as Hermia led to a nomination for the Irene Ryan Scholarship, *Machinal* and *The Conduct of Life*.

*Duet* is a collection of five different scenes from different plays; *Eurydice* by Sarah Ruhl, *Spring Awakening* by Frank Wedekind, *Closer* by Patrick Marber, *Angels in America* by Tony Kushner and *A Doll's House* by Henrik Ibsen. Separately, these plays look into different relationships, but for *Duet*, the scenes chosen were short and specific, adding emotion to the entire play. The acting was on point and didn't feel forced like I, admittedly, thought it would.

The scene from *Eurydice* took place on a

beach. *Eurydice* and *Orpheus* were speaking about love, namely, *Orpheus*' love for music. The despair and confusion was evident on the face of the actress who played *Eurydice*. I was impressed. The scene that impressed me the most, however, was *Closer*. This was a very involved scene dealing with infidelity within two separate relationships. The anger and the hurt came across so well on each one of the cast members. The yelling and crying was eerily convincing.

Equally convincing was the scene from *Angels in America*. In this play, Louis and Prior are a homosexual couple living together. When Louis finds out Prior has a terminal illness, he is forced to choose whether he will stay and care for his partner or leave and not let his own emotions continue to weigh on Prior's spirits. When I spoke with Justin Giles who played Louis, and who is also heterosexual, I learned that playing the role was not all that difficult.

"After reading the play and really getting into the scene," Justin explained, "I realized very quickly that the emotions these two feel for each other are the exact same as any couple would feel, and so I just played the character from that common ground."

Justin also went on to say that both him and Louis love to talk, even if other people don't necessarily want to hear them. This helps when you have to work so closely with someone in order to put on a good performance.

*Spring Awakening* and *A Doll's House* also had convincing emotional performances. In *Spring Awakening*, Melchoir goes to find

## Jeff Mangum Makes a Triumphant Return

It has been nearly thirteen years since the legendary Jeff Mangum last made a formal public appearance. After the 1998 disbanding of Neutral Milk Hotel, the influential indie-powerhouse that is his claim to fame, Mangum chose to lay low and keep out of the public eye. Though it appears he is back in action after announcing a string of solo tour dates in which he will play Neutral Milk Hotel classics across the world, quite possibly for the last time.

The Louisiana acoustic outfit first formed in Ruston in the early 1990s. Most noted for their Holocaust-themed record, *In The Aeroplane Over the Sea*, the band steadily gained a strong fanbase. Mangum, not able to handle the extensive touring and popularity, had a breakdown and called it quits. In the years following their disbandment, the band worked up a sort of cult following, leading up to what is seen as one of the most anticipated comebacks in indie rock history.

The crowd, who was ecstatic to see stint in Jersey City, the sold out crowd erupted into applause as he took the stage at the Landmark Loew's Theatre; however, upon hearing the first chords of "Oh, Comely", the applause immediately turned to complete silence, and the room was filled with both awe and anticipation. Mangum, who sat alone on a stool with his acoustic guitar, plowed through several Neutral Milk Hotel favorites, such as "Gardenhead", "Two-Headed Boy", and "Holland, 1945"; his voice was just as strong as ever, and he didn't miss a beat. Following a passionate rendition of "Naiomi", off the band's first record *On Avery Island*, Neutral Milk Hotel member Scott Spillane took the stage with Mangum to play "April 8th". He also played a twisted, heart-wrenching track that was never officially released, entitled "Little Birds", for the third time in his career after explaining that it is a song that's hard for him to deal with, even after all these years.

Mangum return to the stage, was comprised of men and women both young and old. Many of whom were present had never before had the chance to see Mangum play.

"I've been listening to Jeff Mangum for years", says Lina Nania, a fan from Brooklyn. "I never thought I'd get the chance to witness him playing live. I was only like, eight when he stopped making music. It was just as beautiful as I'd imagined. I knew when he announced dates, I had to be there no matter what".

Another fan, an older man who appeared to be in his thirties, was overheard talking about how Neutral Milk Hotel had played in his basement, and how this performance brought back great memories. "I never thought I'd get to see that again", he said.

For those who missed Jeff Mangum's triumphant return, fear not. He will be returning to the area in January of 2012 for two nights at Brooklyn's Gilman Opera House. Tickets are \$35, and can be purchased through [www.bam.org](http://www.bam.org). Whether this is the last we'll hear from Mangum and Neutral Milk Hotel is still unclear, but what is certain is that he has left his mark.

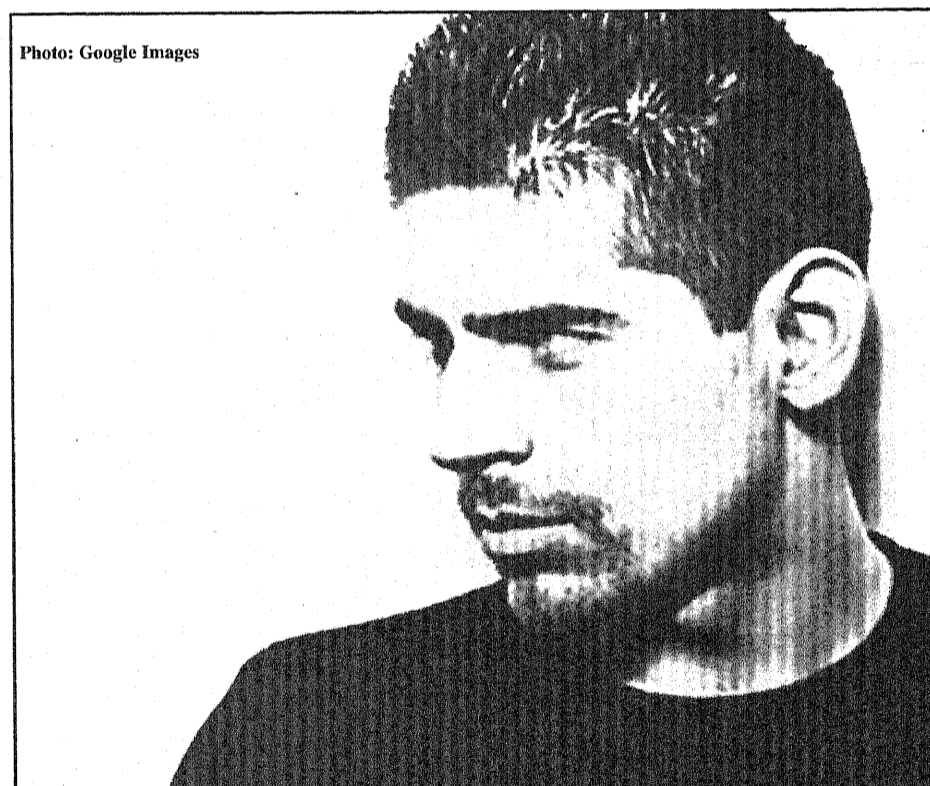
like these aren't held more often arises. What's more, when held why is there very poor promotion and advertisement of the event?

### Learning to go Broke The Harsh Reality of CUNY'S Tuition Hikes

As if the cost of being a college student was not high enough already, CUNY has come to an agreement in recent weeks to raise tuition to \$6,330 a semester plus hundreds of dollars

span, which is bearable if you forget that to be a functional human being, a lot more expenses are on your plate. When you realize that you need to pay for books, rent, food, transportation which for this situation is the

in additional fees at their four year campuses.

The increase of tuition comes at a time when CUNY Chancellor Mathew Goldstein is fighting to get the Pathways proposal approved, which in sense makes the student pay more for a degree that holds less value outside of the CUNY system.

As it stand today the average CUNY tuition by semester is averaged around \$3,000, more than half of the student will be charged to go to school in the future. Even at the current cost of tuition, a student who does not live at home with their parents and get government aid will barely get by, without putting them self in major debt.

Before the tuition hike, a student paying out of pocket would have to shell out merely \$33,600 on tuition alone over a four year

bus, internet for your studies and your utilities you are shelling out an additional \$91,840 based on the average Staten Island cost of living.

After Tibbs sank 2 free throws, Magliore hit a jumper that put the Dolphins up by 5 (61-56) with a 1:50 to play.

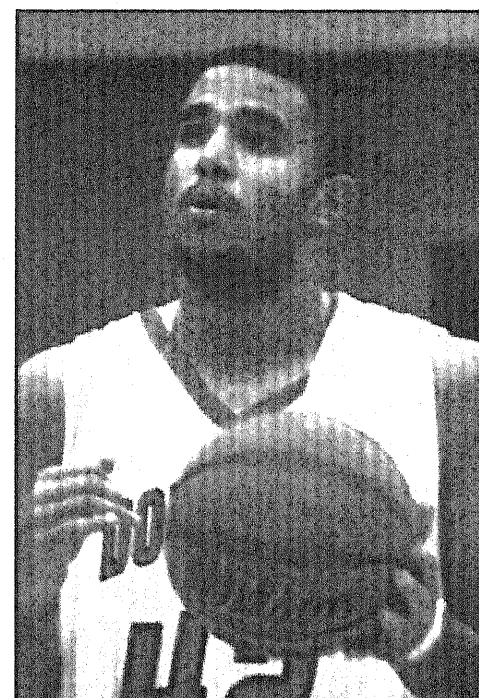
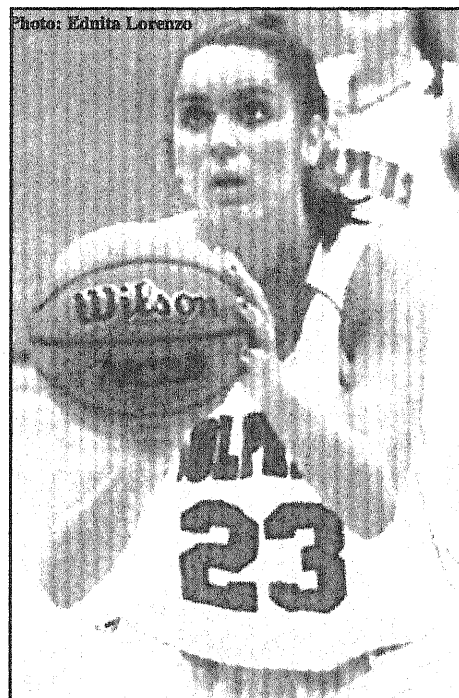
Despite York's attempts, the Dolphins made their free throws to close out the contest.

**TB:** How are you going to handle the adversity when you make your first error at short?

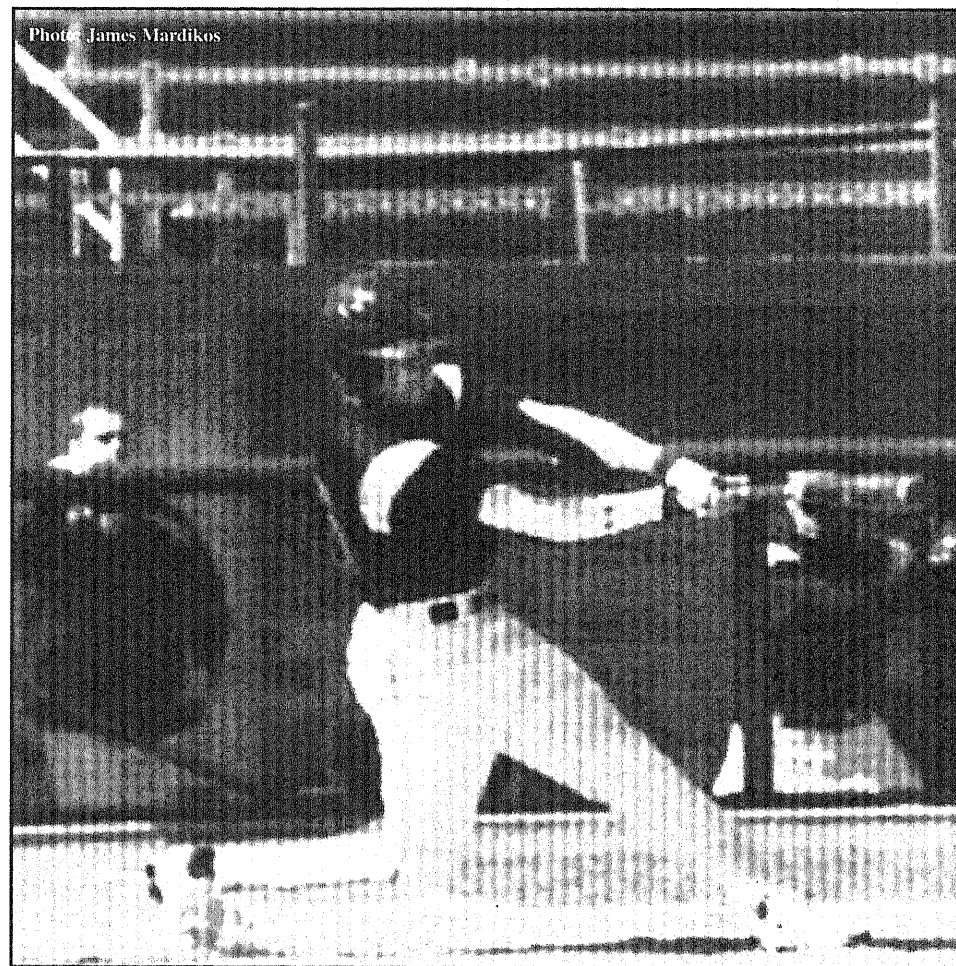
