


Despite the loss, the amount of support from the fans is something that the team will take to heart.

Accounting Club Brings IRS Agent to CSI

CSI and members of the accounting club welcomed IRS special agent Glantz to talk about his experiences and what it takes to become apart of the IRS.

Agent Glantz, who has spent 20 years in the criminal investigations division is now a public information officer.

There is a whole other aspect to the IRS and he proves it is not all deskwork. Working in the field can prove quite dangerous, however there is plenty of room for growth.

There is a lot of opportunity working for the IRS ... you don't have to be stuck doing the same thing," said Glantz.


Cases seen can range from and deal with marriages to cases brought forth by informants. Examples of the cases are, legal and illegal source, narcotics, and terror. When determining whether a case is civil or criminal, intent is a key indicator.

"I've seen the presentation a few times, but the ways the IRS can get tipped off about fraud was the most interesting to me," said Adejoke Adegoke, president of the accounting club.

Most cases come down to greed. The people who steal so they can live lavish lifestyles are usually ones that are investigated. What you have to do is look at the numbers. Sometimes you might see something that doesn't match, so search warrants are often required.

"We don't chase the little guys," said Glantz.

Some of the perps his division has landed include names like Wesley Snipes and Ja Rule. The IRS power is not only limited to their specific area but can also lead abroad. Money is sometimes trans-

fered into overseas accounts and his division is responsible for following the money trail

"My favorite portion was the dumpster diving," said George Paragham, Vice President of the accounting club. "The tactics the IRS use as a whole was very interesting.

For those who hope to land a job with the IRS one needs a minimum of fifteen hours of accounting and nine business credits. You don't need to have a degree in accounting but at the least a bachelors degree of sorts. Upon getting a job with the IRS you would then head to the Federal Law Enforcement training center in Southern Georgia where you would take both Law Enforcement and IRS classes


Waterproof is the best choice because it comes off easily with a make-up remover, yet it doesn't smudge or run throughout the day.



put in.


"It feels good competing home," said Sarah Beth Zayas, a junior cheerleader for CSI. "We get to prove to our school that we are going to take it home."
