October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and students at CSI are encouraged to share their story and break their silence.

The Bertha Harris Women's Center at CSI hosts a clothesline project at the entrance of 1P. Students are invited to anonymously paint a shirt and hang it on the clothesline from October 3rd through October 31st.

The project is an outlet for survivors of domestic and gender-based abuse to take control of their experiences and express their feelings.

But the clothesline is not the only project that the center promotes. On October 15th, the center held their annual 'Take Back The Night' event.

The candlelight walk took place at the Dolphin Lounge. Over 100 people took part in the event to break the stigma and stand in solidarity with victims of gender-based violence.

The Women's Center is "dedicated to meeting the diverse needs of women students, to addressing gender-related issues both on and off-campus, and to empowering women in order to strengthen the entire

Horrifying History of CSI Willowbrook Campus

Why our Campus May be Haunted

What some on the CSI Willowbrook Campus may not know is that the campus used to be a mental institution (known as the Willowbrook State School) for people who had severe disabilities.

Not to also mention but rumors say that a ghost haunts the campus. Believe it or not, it is true. (I'll get into the details to that later).

Built in the 1930's for developmentally disabled children and adults, the school became an institution where the borough's most vulnerable residents were abused, starved and neglected, which was the opposite of its purpose. New York Senator Robert Kennedy referred to Willowbrook as a "snake pit" after a visit to the school and witnessed the deplorable conditions.

Following his visit, Kennedy called

for a five-year action plan to improve treatment of patients and the school. Still, the school remained open.

During the College of Staten Island's 21st annual Willowbrook memorial lecture back in 2014, a former Willowbrook employee, Diane Buglioli, who had worked at the school for 11 years, said that individuals were "denied their human right to humanity" while living at the school. Buglioli said that prisons allot 80 square feet per inmate, whereas Willowbrook provided only 35 square feet per resident, "with no place to put a treasured item, no place to put their (personal) possessions."

From 1930 to 1987, several buildings on the campus (before becoming the College of Staten Island) housed an institution for developmentally disabled children.

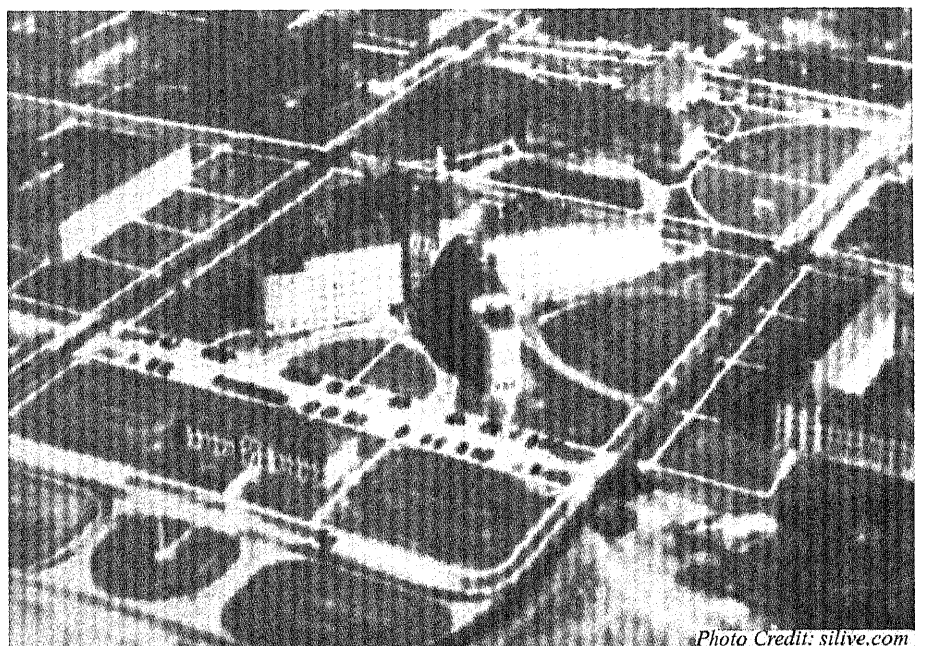


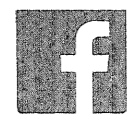

In the wake of Bernie Sanders' health scare, a statement released from his campaign earlier this month confirmed the 78-year old running candidate had received medical attention for a heart related injury. Sanders is back on the campaign trail only 2 weeks after his heart attack, reassuring Americans, at the most recent Democratic debate, that he is up to the stress that comes with being president despite new concerns.

For the American people, it is reasonable to want to know how extensive Sanders' condition was and to question his ability to remain healthy in office if elected. This means only a 5% reduction in our war-machine can fund "College for All."

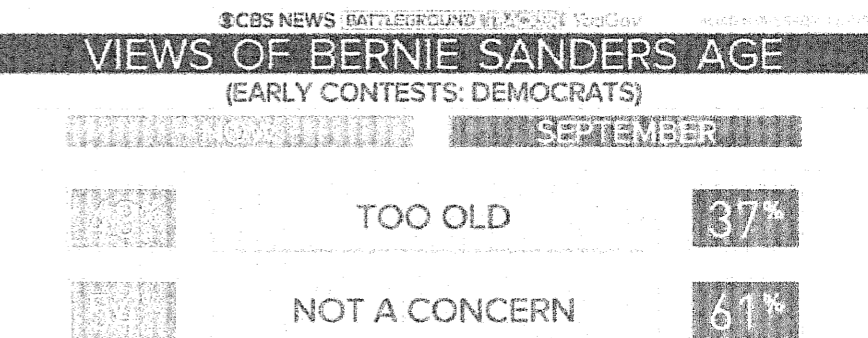

US Withdrawal From Syria Continues Region's Destabilization

Did America Abandon The Kurds in Northern Syria?

On Monday, October 8th, President Donald Trump announced that he will be pulling troops out of northern Syria and abandoning our allies, the Kurds.

The Kurds were very important in defeating ISIS in Syria and they lost thousands of fighters helping the United States in that region.

The pull out of northern Syria is being seen by the Kurds as a betrayal by the United States that left a key ally to defend themselves. The alliance with Kurdish forces began when the United States was looking for new allies to fight against ISIS after they tried to train and give weapons to moderate Muslims, which failed and only produced a few fighters.

The United States knew that an alliance with the Kurds was going to be hard to sell because Turkey saw the Kurds as terrorists and a threat to their country. The PKK (Kurdistan Workers' Party) is a Kurdish militant group based in Turkey and Iraq that have been in an armed conflict with Turkey for years.

Turkey, along with other countries including the United States and the European Union (EU), classified the PKK as a terrorist group. The United States formed an alliance with the YPG (People's Protection Units), which is not classified as a terrorist group but viewed by Turkey as an extension of the PKK.

The U.S. tried to change the name of the YPG to the SDF (Syrian Democratic Forces) to make the Kurds look more rea-

sonable to form an alliance with.

General Raymond Thomas, Commander of the U.S. Special Operations Command, explained the rebranding of the YPG to distance it from the PKK and other terrorist groups.

This worked in most places in the world, especially the U.S., EU, and the mainstream media. The media has glamorized the SDF but Turkey was not buying the rebranding and saw the SDF as a threat to its country.

Turkey is a NATO ally, so when the United States deployed troops to northern Syria and helped the SDF, Turkey couldn't attack the Kurds and risk a conflict with a fellow NATO ally.

When Trump announced that he would be pulling troops out of northern Syria, that gave Turkey the green light to invade northern Syria and attack the Kurds without U.S. interference.

Trump's decision faced backlash from almost everyone in Washington, with some of his biggest supporters like Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-SC) saying that he will hold Trump accountable for Turkey's actions.

The concerns about the decisions is that they will damage the credibility of the United States on the world stage by abandoning one of our allies. The U.S. is trying to get a trade deal with China, a nuclear agreement with North Korea, and a new nuclear deal with Iran.

Another concern is the humanitarian crisis that Turkey's invasion caused, with people reportedly dying and thousands fleeing from northern Syria to Iraq.

Yet another disturbance is that the ISIS prisoners that the Kurds were guarding and the potential of them escaping and regrouping will fuel a resurgency of ISIS in the region. The Kurds will defend themselves against Turkey which will draw resources and guards patrolling the jails with ISIS prisoners to the border to help fight off Turkey.

Turkey wants to create a "safe zone" in northern Syria which will get rid of the Kurdish threat and give over three million Syrian refugees a new place to settle. The

The administration has also tried to establish some kind of peace between the Kurds and Turks and it was mostly unsuccessful, but on October 17th the administration announced a cease-fire with Turkey.

Turkey will stop the invasion for five days and give the Kurds time to escape the region.

Trump has praised the agreement as a big win for peace, but the Kurds say that Turkey hasn't stopped the attack and they won't leave because they didn't agree to the cease-fire.

Trump administration has been pushing back against the criticism by not wanting to stay in the Middle East forever and by claiming this is a problem between the Turks and Kurds.

The whole troop withdrawal has opened a new chapter in the even more complicated Syrian conflict in the Middle East.

According to the Clothesline Project's official website, "Clothesline Projects all over the world remind people of the real meaning of violence statistics that are often ignored."

Office Manager Lori Uccio describes the Women's Center as a home away from home that offers resources and opportunities for students of all genders.

"[The Women's Center] encourages a confidential support network among students, staff, and faculty, while also serving as a conduit of information about counseling and other resources available to women on campus and in the surrounding communities."

The center runs a 4-credit internship class, WGS 490, where students can intern at the center and study feminist theory.

The center also has relationships with other gender-based organizations, such as Safe Horizon, the largest victim services non-profit in the country.

Based in New York City, Safe Horizon "envision[s] a society free of violence and abuse. [Safe Horizon] will lead the way by empowering victims and survivors to find safety, support, connection, and hope."

Although domestic violence can come in different forms, abuse often follows a cycle. First, tensions build up between the abuser and the victim. The victim tries

to satisfy the abuser in fear of the consequences.

Second is the abuse, which can be verbal, emotional, or physical. This can last for short or long periods of time.

The third stage is reconciliation, where the abuser apologizes, blames the victim, or even denies abuse.

The fourth stage is called the "honeymoon" stage, in which abuse does not occur and the relationship is generally peaceful. The victim is likely to stay with the abuser but the cycle does not end.

The center provides counseling, support, and scholarships for both survivors and victims of the cycle.

In addition to interning at the center and learning about feminist theory, those enrolled in WGS 490 can create their own events about issues that matter to them.

Throughout the year, the Women's Center collects accessories, feminine products, and gifts for organizations such as Bottomless Closet and Safe Horizon.

It also hosts discussions and panels about equal rights, salary negotiation, and sexual health. Students can earn CLUE credits for participating at some of these

events.

Toys for children and gifts for mothers in the care of Safe Horizon will be collected throughout campus from November 4th to December 10th. Uccio shares that the center will have a gift wrapping party on December 10th for donations gathered throughout the holiday season, and encourages students to attend.

In 1938, a 375 acre section of Willowbrook, Staten Island converted into a hospital treatment of its "students." Before the exposed mentally handicapped children.

When construction was completed in 1942, the buildings were converted to a United States Army Hospital named Hal-loren General Hospital. In October 1947 the New York State Department of Mental Hygiene took over the buildings renaming it the Willowbrook State School.

By 1962, the school had been designed for 4,000 children but quickly spread to 6,000. The patients were understaffed and were locked in rooms for an extended length of time and were forced to sleep on floors covered in their own excrement. Many of the children were underfed and most ran down the halls partially dressed or naked. Between 1963 and 1966 medical studies were conducted on the children, infecting them with hepatitis, some by feeding them the stool of other infected patients.

The Staten Island Advance began uncovering the questionable practices of the Willowbrook State School in the mid-1960s. Jane Kurtin, a reporter of The Staten Island Advance, was one of the first to cover the abhorrent conditions at the school, though the stories did not gain the attention she'd hoped for.

It wasn't until ABC News' Geraldo Rivera exposed "Willowbrook: The Last Disgrace" that the national spotlight was

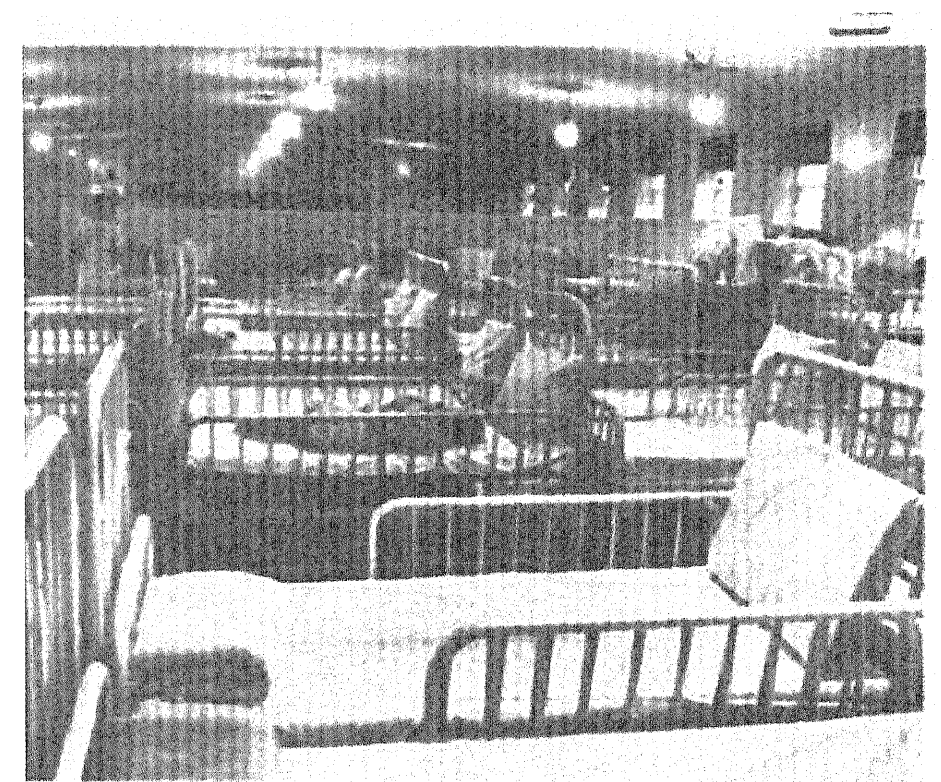
turned on to Staten Island and the school's treatment of its "students." Before the exposed aired, the network warned: "Tonight as a public service, we're going to make you sick." "This is what it looked like, this is what it sounded like; It smelled of filth, it smelled of disease and it smelled of death."

In 1971 funding to the school was cut leading to worsening conditions. Local newspapers and media including Geraldo Rivera, reported on the overcrowding, lack of sanitary conditions, and the physical and mental abuse forced upon the disabled children. As a result, lawsuits were filed against New York State which would lead to reforms many years later.

In 1974 the area was renamed the Staten Island Developmental Center and in 1983 a plan to close the school was announced. The last child to reportedly leave the school was in September of 1987.

It doesn't end there though. In 1987 Andre Rand who had worked in the school, killed and buried Jennifer Schweiger, a patient at the school, on the abandoned school grounds. Because of this incident, students at the College of Staten Island have reported seeing figures moving through the shadows, strange noises and calls and unsettling feelings.

If you take night classes, and especially if you drive, be careful. You may get that unexpected creepy feeling that something is watching and following you.

"I made seven thousand dollars in seven months," said Traina. "It was the perfect amount of money that I needed to go to work at Disney while I took my gap semester."

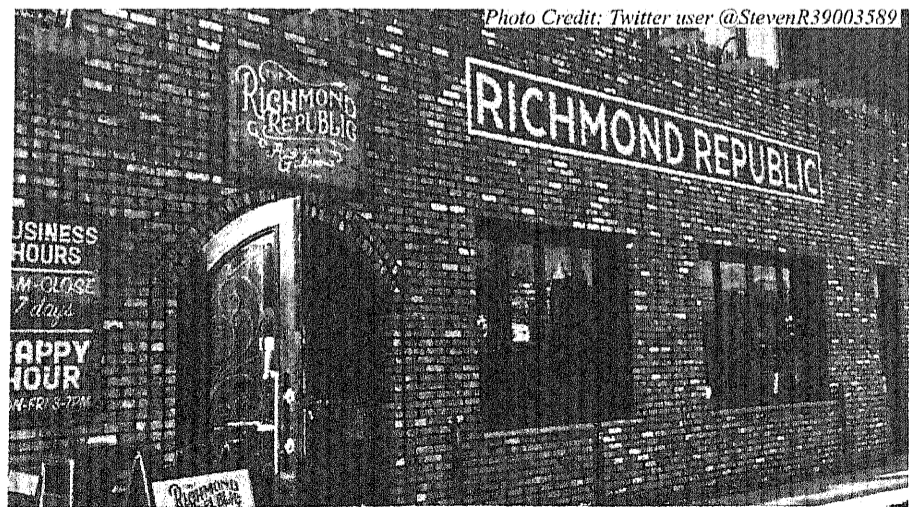
During Traina's first year of college, she worked numerous jobs from being a

makeup artist, to babysitting, to working in ice-cream parlors. She quickly realized that those jobs were not for her and obtained her bartending license at 19 years old.

Bartending was not all smooth sailing at the beginning.

"My first bartending job was for a catering company where I ran an open bar with a more experienced bartender," said Traina. "An important rule about bartending is not to get too drunk, especially if you

are new, but me and the bartending crew got all pretty drunk at a random couples' wedding."

Despite the complications Traina witnessed as a bartender, she was accepted into the Disneyland Internship Program, which meant she had to move to California for a year.

Before officially entering the Disney program, she brainstormed ways to make money if she wanted to survive in California for three months.

This prompted Traina to apply to every place she could, including a strip club in New Jersey.

"The funniest thing was that I showed up to the interview in nice clothes, looking very professional and the man asked me: what are you wearing?" said Traina. "Then he said that I had a pretty face and would start next week."

This was going to be hard because her parents wouldn't endorse her new place of work...so she had to keep it a secret.

Traina was nervous, but she needed this job because she was about seven months away from beginning her internship. Her first week was all she needed to realize that this was the perfect short term job for her circumstance.

"I had a guy that would give me one-hundred dollars just to massage my hands at the bar while he talked to me," Traina said. "It was weird though because one minute, I'd be talking to someone, then they'd walk away, get a lap dance, come back and tell me more about their lives."

Traina never entertained even the idea of partaking in anything more than the hand massages, and customers knew that. Working at the strip club showed her the sad reality that these are men who often have deeper reasons for attending a strip club.

These men at times have issues at home or at work, and Traina became the person they confided in. These men would tell her things about their daughters with disabilities, their ailing wives, and many more reasons why they use the strip club as an escape.

Seven months later, Traina left for Disney with seven thousand dollars in her pocket.

"My parents finally just found out," Traina said. "It appeared on my taxes and I had to tell my mom so she knew that I never did anything crazy and I only did the bartending."

It's not only delicious, but addictive. Even said writer still drinks soda after doing extensive research about it.

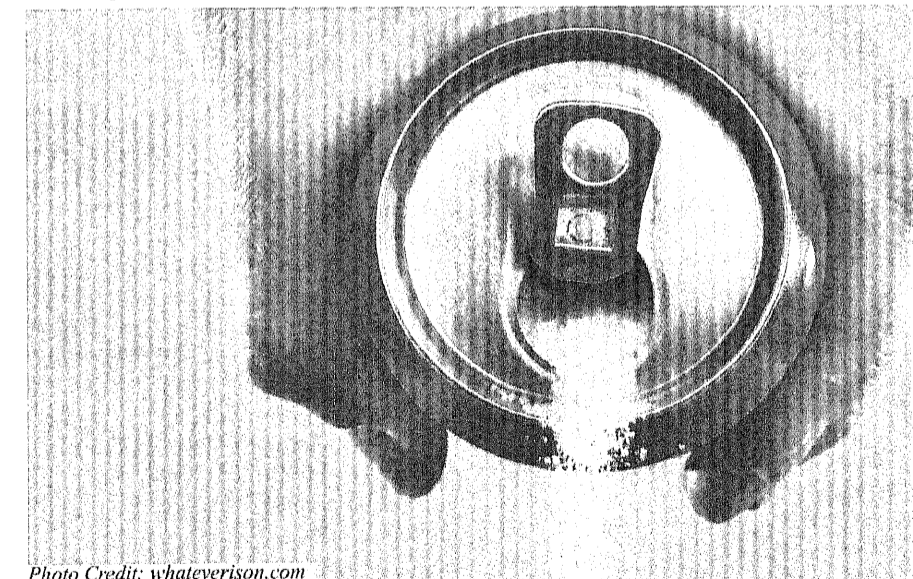

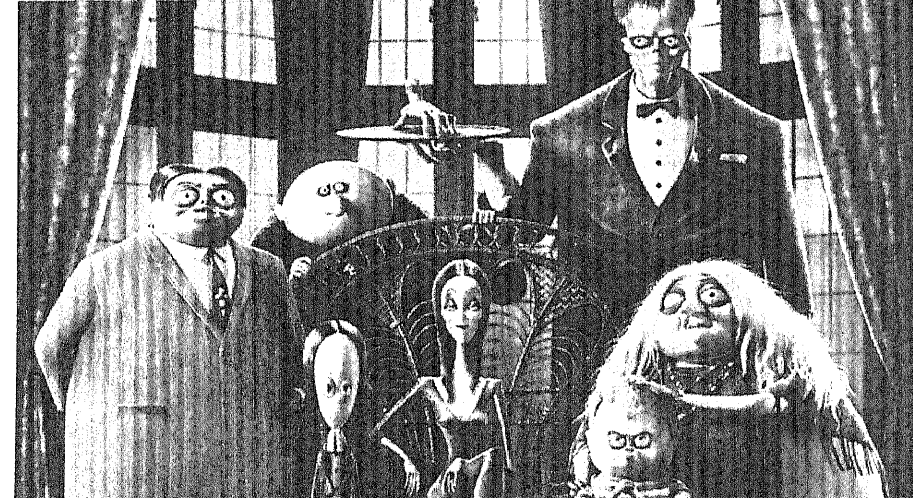
Is Everybody's Favorite Spooky Halloween Movie, "The Addams Family," Really a Flop?

Bonilla doesn't believe her mother disliked her natural hair. Instead, she believes her mother instilled the plan to straighten her hair in hopes she wouldn't get discriminated against in school or job interviews.

Her mother's concerns weren't unreasonable. In fact, as stated by The New York Times, it took until this year for a law to pass in New York City that prevented jobs to use one's hair as a reason not to hire someone. For years, many qualified job applicants were denied jobs due to their hair.

In high school, Bonilla became exposed to more diversity. There were women of color, many more girls that looked like her. Their hair caught her attention the most.

Although there were still girls who would straighten their hair as she did, she noticed that more girls would wear their hair natural. Despite her immediate interest in the natural look, it took Bonilla until senior year to finally make the transition.

"As a senior, I became friends with so many girls who rocked their natural hair and I knew I needed to join the natural wave," said Bonilla. "I didn't care if I stood out anymore, I wanted to love my hair the way it's meant to be."

The transitions back to curly hair did not come easily. After 12 years of straight-

ening her hair, she noticed how dry and damaged it became. She needed to cut her hair short and start all over.

The process to revive healthy curls required a long process for Bonilla. It took her about a year to see a resemblance of her healthy natural hair.

The daily grind to get her curls back paid off for her because after all of it, she felt her confidence had doubled. She no longer felt to have hidden her true self, which made her feel powerful.

Blizzard banned a player going by the name of Blitzchung. On Oct 8th 2019, he was in a Tawianize tournament for Hearthstone.

either of them and they went to the other borough in New York, the Brooklyn Nets.

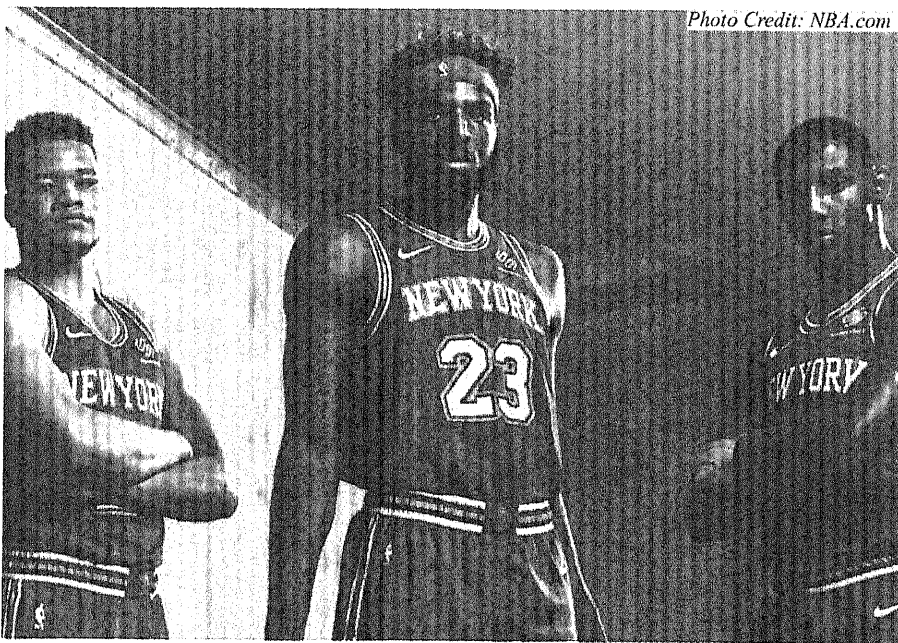
