

An hour or two later I returned to my car with a warmth and a sense of pride at the thought that I was a pioneer in these happenings and these old familiar words flashed into my mind. "Our school is not the biggest, but we hope to make it the best."

Class of 1959

Henry Ward Beecher once said "Every tomorrow has two handles. We can take hold of it with the handle of anxiety or the handle of faith.

"We should live for the future and yet should find our life in the fidelities of the present; the last is the only method of the first."

The Class of 1959 will be graduated in a year which is expected to be one of greatest opportunity and at the same time one of greatest anxiety. Like Beecher, I suggest that you take hold of your tomorrow with "the handle of faith." Faith in what? Faith in the future of the world and of mankind; faith in your college and in the education you received from it; and, most of all, faith in yourself. For some years you will have neither time nor responsibility in this onrushing world for anxiety concerning economic depression, war, or possible incineration of the earth by a frustrated, mad dictator. Any or all of these imposters may overtake us, but there is nothing which you can do about it.

Little did we as youth dream that the time would come when the adage "hitch your wagon to a star" given us by our advisers would become a literal possibility. No doubt the field of space travel, exploration, and perhaps colonization, will provide bright futures for many, perhaps even some of you, in the years to come.

The old adage is still valid, however, in its original concept. I exhort each of you to set your goal high but, as Beecher implied, to keep your feet on the ground. You will not reach the "star" in a blaze of light in the figurative sense although it may now become possible in a literal sense. The sure way to get there is by steady, hard work, and by adding to your knowledge, meanwhile building a reputation for reliability and integrity and cultivating a personality to win favor among your friends and coworkers. As the poet Longfellow put it (and he is still correct)

"The heights by great men reached and kept Were not attained by sudden flight, But they, while their companions slept, Were toiling upward in the night."
