In celebration of the turn of the century, we have chosen the theme of "High Tech CUNY" for this years Dolphin. Some of the featured academics are from the Engineering department as well as the various learning centers on campus. CSI has over 1500 networked computers on campus in it's many laboratories, learning centers and study centers. Not only are all the computers on campus networked, but this year President Springer has started to install a wireless system on campus. In almost every picture one can see a computer somewhere in the background. This accessability to resources makes CSI a great place to "stay connected."



The College of Staten Island is a four-year, senior college of The City University of New York that offers exceptional opportunities to all its students. Programs in the liberal arts and sciences and professional studies lead to bachelor's and associate's degrees. The master's degree is awarded in selected fields of study, and the College participates in doctoral programs of the CUNY Graduate School and University Center in Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, and Physics. A broad general education is assured through requirements that allow students to explore a range of fields of knowledge and acquire educational breadth in mathematics, the sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities.

Requirements for the bachelor's degree provide a disciplined and cumulative program of study in a major field of inquiry. Enrollment in baccalaureate programs requires freshmenadmission standards consonant with those of CUNY senior colleges. Requirements for the associate's degree provide a curriculum based on study in a specific area, often directed toward a career. Enrollment in associate's degree programs is open to all students with a high school diploma or the equivalent. The Honors College, instituted in Fall 1997, is designed for a limited number of students who have demonstrated a well-developed commitment to learning and who intend to continue their undergraduate education in graduate and/or professional schools. The Honors College offers a challenging curriculum and an enriched extra-curricular environment. Students who have earned, or expect to earn, an academic diploma with an average of at least 90 are eligible to apply for admission to the Honors College. The academic year follows a two-semester pattern, with a separate summer session. Classes are scheduled day, evening, and weekends. The College has an extensive Continuing Education program and offers off-campus courses with and without credit. CSI was founded in 1976 through the union of two existing colleges -- Staten Island Community College and Richmond College. Staten Island Community College, the first community college in the University, opened in 1955. Richmond College, an upper-division college that offered undergraduate and graduate degrees to students who had successfully completed the first two years of college study elsewhere, was founded in 1965. The merger of these two colleges resulted in the only public four-year institution of higher learning on Staten Island.

The Campus

Completed in 1994, the 204-acre campus of CSI/CUNY is the largest site for a college in New York City. Set in a park-like landscape, the campus is centrally located on the Island. Mature trees and woodlands, flowering trees and ornamental plantings, fields and outdoor athletic facilities, the great lawn, sculpture, and seating areas create a rural oasis in an urban setting.

Fourteen renovated neo-Georgian buildings serve as classrooms, laboratories, and offices. The academic buildings house approximately 200 modern laboratories. Each also contains a study lounge for students, department and program offices, and faculty offices.

In this attractive learning environment, classrooms and academic offices are located in buildings that form the North and South Academic Quadrangles, connected by the Alumni Walk, with the Center for the Arts located midway between the Quadrangles at the fountain plaza. The Library and Campus Center serve as focal points for connecting walkways as well as for the Academic Quadrangles. The Sports and Recreation Center together with the athletic fields are located near the main entrance to the campus.

Astrophysical Observatory: The 16-foot dome astrophysical observatory was completed in 1996. In addition to serving students in astronomy courses, the facility will be used for faculty and student research projects, environment monitoring projects, and community programs.

Biological Sciences/Chemical Sciences building: An ultra- modern facility, the building contains classrooms, laboratories, faculty offices, research facilities for faculty and students, the Center for Environmental Science, and the Center for Developmental Neuroscience and Developmental Disabilities.

Campus Center: The Campus Center incorporates facilities for a complete program of student activities and offices for student organizations; food services; health services, a study lounge; bookstore; and the studios of WSIA-FM, the student operated radio station.

Center for the Arts: Entered from the Great Lawn and from the Campus Walk, the Center houses two academic wings for programs in the arts as well as superb public spaces: the Clara and Arleigh B. Williamson Theater, a 900-seat concert hall, a recital hall, an experimental theater, lecture halls, and the Gallery.

Library: Designed with inviting reading rooms, open shelves, and study carrels, its research and study facilities are enhanced by computer data-based operations available to all students. The Library Media Services make accessible pedagogical multi-media materials to distant classrooms and laboratories through the campus fiber-optic network.

Sports and Recreation Center: This 77,000 square-foot multi-purpose facility and surrounding athletic fields serve the intercollegiate and intramural sports and recreation programs for students. On a membership basis, faculty, staff, alumni, and the general public also have access to the facilities.


To the Class of 2001:




















rally claiming electoral fraud by the ruling coalition led by President Slobodan Milosevic in the Sept. 24 presidential election against Vojislav Kostunica.











The students in Professor Imberman's class pictured here are building robots. The goal is to simulate the technology used by the NASA space program on their roving modules. With the use of two photosensors the robot should be able to program itself to

follow a designated course. The bodies of the robots are made of "Lego." This enables the robots to take on many forms. These robots are controlled by onboard sixty megabyte computers and are powered by nicad batteries. The course is set up on the classroom floor and reflective tape is used as a guide for the photosensors to



By using programmed robots to thuink for themselves unmanned space travel is possible. If a module strays from it's original course it can correct itself and therefore not be lost from its mission.








Astrophysical Observatory

One function of the Observatory is to engage in a NASA research program. The purpose of this program, as illustrated by senior Engineering student Ashado Smith, is to watch for errant meteors as they come towards earth. This presentation submitted by Ashado depicts the extensive research being done here on campus. (Shown right with Professor Irving Robbins)

Origin

Minor Planets are remnants from the origin of the Solar System. The first minor planet was discovered on January 1, 1801. Today there are about 4,000 minor planets on file which have accurately known orbits, and some 6,000 more which have poorly known orbits.

Danger to Humanity

About every 100 years, an object with the force of several atomic bombs strikes the Earth. The last such impact occurred in Siberia in 1908. It destroyed an area of radius equivalent to the distance from downtown Manhattan to Philadelphia. If it had struck Manhattan, 15 million people would've died.

Goal

To calculate and update positional data on asteroids, whose orbits are weakly known, as well as data for asteroids that come near the Earth, called unusual or NEO, Near Earth Objects, so as to possibly know when these objects are heading on a collision, early enough to divert them, thus avoiding potential catastrophes.

Research

Obtained positional measurements are used by the Minor Planet Center (MPC), at Harvard Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory, in conjunction with the data from other observatories world wide to refine orbital elements of asteroids.

Our goals are accomplished by carrying out a technique called Astrometry, which utilizes a MEADE LX-200 16'' Schmidt-Cassegrain telescope, AP-6 CCD, the CCDSoft and TheSKY software.

Images of the area of interest are captured and processed using the CCDSoft software

Two or more processed images of the same area of interest, taken minutes apart, are blinked simultaneously to locate asteroid

CCD Soft software which interfaces with the Sky Program is used to identify & measure 'located' asteroid

The CSI Asteroid and NEO Tracking and Hunting Research has been successful in contributing to the refinement of orbital elements of asteroids. Our data is evaluated by the Minor Planet Center. Successful measurements are used by the MPC to refine orbital elements of asteroids.

The English Learning Center

The English Learning Center is located in building 2S-216. The administrator, Dr. Gail Wood, engages students to reach deeply within themselves to find their strengths in learning and applying them throughout their college careers. The methods of her teaching are innovative and effective, and can be seen being administered by peer tutors at the center.

These tutors, trained by Dr. Wood, not only gain teaching skills, but insight into their own learning abilities. Peer tutors are asked to discover how they learn in order to be able to pass this knowledge on. Tutors help students assess their auditory, visual, and kinesthetic abilities in order to better focus their skills.

While the center is very effective in helping ESL, and remedial students, the tutors equally benefit from the experience. Dr. Wood is the author of the book, "How to Study," which accentuates these skills.



Carol went above and beyond her duty by not only ensuring that her office assisted students in all their activities, but personally acted as a mediary in all





Senior Matt Franzreb defends the basket in what was Franzreb's last home game. (right)



Women's Basketball


